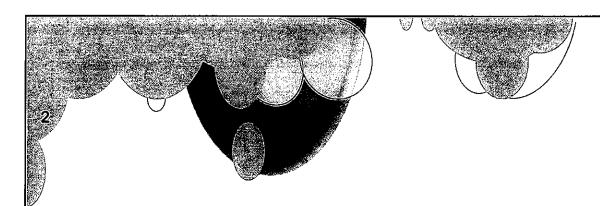

# BOYS AND GIRLS CLUBS OF SANTA FE/DEL NORTE PROGRAM OVERVIEW

One-on-One Mentoring: The Club matches qualified mentors with troubled or at risk youth who need, or who will benefit, from having a caring, responsible adult in their lives helping to ensure they continue toward a positive outcome in a K-12 school program, or progress in pursuing other documented educational goals.

Group Mentoring: We provide Group Mentoring for youth ages 6-18 who meet need/risk criteria, with the goal of deepening the impact and expanding the number of youth who benefit from Club mentoring services. The Group Mentoring services are delivered by trained professional staff mentors at Boys & Girls Club program sites as part of a comprehensive youth development program.

**SMART Moves:** (Skills, Mastery & Resistance Training) is a prevention/ education program that addresses problems such as drug and alcohol use and premature sexual activity.

<u>Art</u>: Provides educational arts and crafts activities. Each activity begins with cultural background information/discussions or engaging literature that provides the children with cultural benefits.

**Sports, Fitness & Recreation**: These programs help develop fitness, positive use of leisure time, reduction in stress, appreciation of the environment and social & interpersonal skills.

<u>Computer Lab</u>: Club Tech provides young members with the technology resources to help them perform better in school and, eventually, the workplace and ensure that every child that walks through our doors is equipped with the access and skills necessary for success in the 21st century.

<u>Healthy Meals & Snacks</u>: Members are served daily with a nutritious afterschool snack to provide energy for recreational activities and completing homework assignments.

<u>Teen Nights:</u> Provides safe and fun recreational/leisure activities for local teens ages 13-18. Activities include dances, concerts, intramural sports, recreational exhibitions or competitions such as skateboarding/rollerblading, basketball tournaments, talent shows, movie and bowling nights, etc.

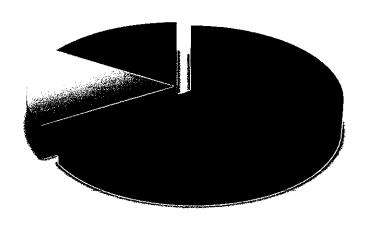

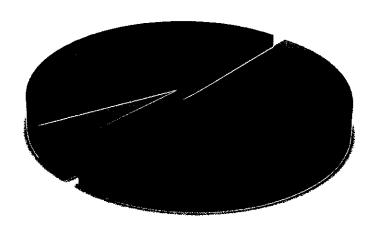
