# LITERACY ACCESS FUND ANNOUNCES PHASE THREE OF 2018 GRANTS WITH AWARD TO THE NORWOOD PUBLIC LIBRARY

CHESTER, PA - Literacy Access Fund, a 501(c)(3), public charity, announces a grant award of \$10,000 to the Norwood Public Library in Norwood, Delaware County, Pennsylvania. Literacy Access Fund secures funding from corporate, foundation, and individual partners in order to provide financial support to underfunded public libraries through a competitive granting process. The goal of the organization is to help libraries provide equal access to quality resources for young learners, regardless of economic factors.

This award to the Norwood Public Library was made possible through partnership funding from the 3M Foundation, based in Saint Paul, MN. This award will help fund the acquisition of state-of-the-art technology for young children and implement the **1,000 Books Before Kindergarten** program.

Holly Goldsborough, President of the Library's Board of Directors, noted the Board's gratitude to Literacy Access Fund for the award. "Having been in early childhood education for my whole career, I understand how the value and impact that exposure to this technology and early literacy in the library will enable children to become better readers and more likely to succeed in school."

"Combining print and state of the art technology in our programs will increase children's learning over print alone. Children learn better using multi-modal tools that enhance cognitive, language, and literacy skills," according to Eileen Baker, Director of the Library. "Since the Norwood Public Library plays a significant role in the community, we know these new resources will encourage regular library use by families, and, in accordance with our mission, will foster lifelong learning."

Deborah B. Sorgi, Ed.D., Chair, Director & President of Literacy Access Fund, shared her thoughts. "Literacy Access Fund is pleased to support the Norwood Public Library's initiatives to introduce children and families to a wide range of activities to promote pre-literacy, maintain programming qualities that are vital to early learning in a library environment, and provide opportunities to develop technology skills in young children." Dr. Sorgi also noted, "We are continuing to identify and support deserving public libraries to help their littlest members read and succeed in school and life."
