

- Mauka Renovation- to start ASAP

\*Rick (Head of Maintenance Department) returned with updates for concerns shared earlier in the meeting

Updates:

- Pool renovation- spa jet is working; water is warm; target completion is next Wednesday (first week of November)
- East wing stairs re:hazard strip- cannot find hazard. Needs it to be pointed out to him.
- TV (Grace's)- Spectrum having issues with certain model cable boxes
- Painters- Thursday night Nov. 2<sup>nd</sup> TV room and library will be painted.

Michael shared that he can't always say yes to everyone's wants or needs being that we have close to 400 residents. He does not like saying no but has to sometimes. He also thanked residents for their patience during the renovation process and during transitioning of furniture period.

#### Community Concerns/needs/wants

- Resident Ardie expressed the need for a computer chair after learning about the upcoming liquidation of furniture. Michael said he had one for her.
- Resident asked if there were dollies available to help with their efforts of moving furniture to their rooms. They were informed that there were 4 in each building. Residents shared that a few of them had flat tires and that air was needed in them.
- Residents were told that they could place their old furniture with left over furniture IF charity is secured.
- Resident Bobbie asked if their families could take furniture. "Yes."
- Cottage 10 and 11 are storage holding areas currently and if any residents were interested in art work/paintings within the cottage then they were told to contact Enrichment Coordinators to schedule a visit. No residents are allowed to enter cottage without an associate.
