

NEWSLETTER:

Mark Leder reported we had a mailing list problem on some of the mailings for January and he will speak to the printer. Printing costs of 12 newsletter per year for members requesting mailed issues is approximately \$38.00 per year, dues are \$35.00 per year.

Membership should be encouraged to accept an email copy of newsletter if they have computer access. Newsletter is going well.

WEBSITE: Facebook – Brendan Keilen states that the site receives a few inquiries. He will gather some metrics from the each site visit and will update the board concerning know how many people visit the site, etc.

SPECIAL COMMITTEES REPORTS – SHORT TERM COMMITTEES

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Memorial Fund – The fund was created last month to capture donations received. The Club is still deciding on the use of the fund.

Some ideas were put forth about using it for tours. Friendship picnic was used before for the club and this may also be considered. –

Update to the new membership ideas that Scott Huberty mentioned last month. There are some parallels to EAA in that TCMAFC may need to find new people to pass on the passion for the club & Model A's, such as the Young Eagles program of the EAA. Events such as County Fairs or the Yellowstone Trail run event could garner interest for the club. Additional possibility is to have cars at the local high school for driver's education classes to highlight advancements in auto safety. Catherine Jammer suggested auto shop at the high school or possibly historical societies interest. Possibly there may be an insurance liability for having people in the cars or going for a drive? Scott explained that some coverage may be able to be extended from MARC or MAFCA?. Doug Portlance thinks that as far as insurance goes there may not be an issue if individuals give rides. May possibly be different if letting people drive. He will look into this as far as insurance goes. Thom asked how we decide what events to move forward with are chosen. Scott volunteers to check out the Yellowstone Trail option and do the legwork to get this going. Mark Leder states he liked the idea of an impromptu car show, however COVID may hamper this well into the summer of 2021. Doug Persing explained that since it's in the events category that we don't need to vote on this. We just need to pick an event and if something works, go with it and if it doesn't then we start again. We will begin with reviewing the Yellowstone Trail event. Scott will update board at February board meeting.

NEW BUSINESS:

Thom requested that the board members begin thinking about budget modifications for February Board meeting. Historical documents from Neal Anderson, have been addressed. Doug Persing suggested that once documents are scanned, they then can be labeled and identified. Immediate need is to scan and reduce the volume of items that need storage. The technology is there for these to be scanned and retouched so they are not ruined. Dale states that he is available and willing to help sort these items. Dave Peterson pointed out that items need to be identified and cataloged so that they are not piled in a corner. Catherine Jammer states a working session is needed to ID these items. Dale states that to begin, move the items, so that they are safe for now and then the working can begin once we can gather again.

MARC and MAFCA Renewal Forms have been updated.

Doug Persing brought up a new business item. Scott Petersen has hats and badges that are sold for the club, and his membership status is uncertain, and he believes we should find someone to take on these duties.

This will continue and may include members from the Model A Ford Club of Colorado (MAFCC), along with You tube guru Paul Shinn for February's zoom meeting.

Doug Carr sent a letter to the Club looking for a well restored car in in good condition. Mr. Carr is not a member yet, but Dale Pomerleau will contact Mr. Carr to discuss vehicle needs and talk about joining TCMAFC.



Ford Sedan Delivery Showcases South Bend Lathe

The South Bend Lathe Works, named after the City where it is located was formed in 1906 by John J and Miles W. O'Brien, twin brothers, who were born in Ireland. The pair were trained tool and die-makers that started the manufacturing firm after receiving their mechanical engineering degrees from Purdue University in Indiana.

The successful company apparently learned early on that equipping its salesmen with a vehicle outfitted with machine tools and taking them directly to prospective buyer's helped sell its products.

This vehicle is a Model "A" Ford sedan delivery and appears to be a 1931 model.

The Ford contains one of South Bend's base model lathes that does not have a "quick change" feed and threading gearbox. The stack of gears that have to be changed one at a time is visible on the pull-out table's left side. Accessories and tooling are mounted on the driver's sidewall, and that weight is offset by the main part of the fairly heavy machine being placed on the passenger side of the Ford truck.


