


July 4th Independence Day



At the Continental Congress In Philadelphia on June 7th 1776 Richard Henry Lee stated "Resolved: That these United Colonies are, and of right ought to be, free and independent States, that they are absolved from all allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connection between them and the State of Great Britain is,

and ought to be, totally dissolved." On June 11 the resolution was postponed and a committee of five were selected to write the words that would make the case to the world for independence from Great Britain. The committee included John Adams, Roger Sherman, Benjamin Franklin, Robert R. Livingston and Thomas Jefferson. Thomas Jefferson drafted the document. The Document was presented to the Continental Congress on July 1st and one day later on July 2nd 12 of the 13 colonies voted to accept. New York abstained. The next two days were devoted to some minor changes and on the 4th of July the Declaration of Independence was officially adopted. Nine of the colonies voted for the document, Pennsylvania and South Carolina voted no, Delaware was undecided and New York abstained. This is our National Holiday, yet the Declaration of Independence was agreed to on July 2nd. After two days of revisions it was agreed to and signed by the congress. It does not say Declaration of Independence, rather, The Unanimous Declaration of the thirteen United States of America.

National Congress in Boston July 9-13 The 126th Annual National Congress will be held in Boston this year and should be quite an affair. An all day tour is available on Saturday to Lexington and Concord. This will include a stop at the Buckman Tavern where Paul Revere awoke John Hancock and Samuel Adams. On Sunday we will have a Color Guard procession to the Old South Church where the Memorial Service will be held. This was the church that was originally a meeting place before the Boston Tea Party. John Hancock and Dr. Joseph Warren spoke there. At times over 5000 people were in session. The British ruined the church when they filled it with dirt and used it to practice horse riding. A fire in 1872 practically destroyed the meeting place and a New Old South Church was built. Today the New Old South Church is on Copley Square.



Arizona State Society Founder, Robinson, Recognized

David Swanson realized a dream when the Arizona and New Mexico Societies jointly held a Gravestone Laying Ceremony for Compatriot Herbert Fulwiler Robinson on June 13th, 2016 at Sunset Memorial Park, Albuquerque, NM. Compatriot Swanson put considerable time and resources into proving that Compatriot Robinson was officially the "Father of the Arizona Society, Sons of the American Resolution (1896.)" It should be noted that the ceremony also celebrates the 120th Anniversary of the Arizona Society. An informal dinner was held the day before the ceremony (June 12th) at El Pinto Restaurant. The dinner was well attended. As for the ceremony itself, a warm welcome was given by Historian Swanson to the attendees followed by the AZ & NM Color Guard members presenting the colors. Arizona Society Chaplain J. Michael Jones gave the Invocation. Introduction of guests were then made, each of which made brief comments: VPG, Rocky Mountain District Michael E. Barger; Arizona Society President Stephen J. Miller and New Mexico Society President Andrew S. Lyngar, Jr. A brief talk of the life of Herbert F. Robinson (see attached document) was then given by Historian Swanson. Chaplain Jones gave a blessing for those assembled followed by the Gravestone Placement by cemetery staff which was closely supervised by Compatriot Swanson. A benediction was given by New Mexico Society Chaplain John Thomas followed by the retirement of colors by the color guard. State Flag Certificate Presentation Flag Day June 14,

Pebble Creek Community Recognized for Its Patriotism

This year, Flag Day may not have been recognized by everyone (including the Google website and *The Arizona Republic* newspaper which, sadly, did not carry even one mention), but here in Pebble Creek our residents were celebrated for their patriotism and respect for the flag with a special ceremony and awarding of certificates. Local chapters of the Sons of the Revolution (SAR) and the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) presented the Pebble Creek Homeowners Association with certificates of award for the "proper use, correct display and patriotic presentation of the flag of the United States of America."

"This is not a certificate to be taken lightly," noted DAR Regent (and Pebble Creek resident) Flora Conley. "There is a lot to know about flag protocol and procedure. Just look it up on the Internet and you'll find there are a great many laws and regulations which are not always easy to follow, nor, in fact, always followed. Members of our DAR Chapter, along with the local SAR Chapter, have always been impressed with the spirit of patriotism in Pebble Creek and the proper observation of flag protocol at their many events."

SAR State VP and Flag Chairman, Steven Monez, spoke about the history of the American flag, noting it was "born" on June 14, 1777 after the Continental Congress adopted this resolution: "That the Flag of the United States be 13 stripes alternate red and white, that the Union be 13 stars white in a blue field representing a new constellation." Additional stars have been added 27 times between 1777 and 1960. Monez also noted that it was in 1916, that President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation that officially established June 14 as Flag Day.

Accepting the certificates on behalf of Pebble Creek homeowners, HOA President, John Kiekbusch, thanked the SAR, and DAR chapters for all they contribute to our community and noted that we will display awards with great pride. Article by Susan K. Wilson, Pebble Creek Communications Team


