- Open to current LBCC students
- Only one entry per student
- All essays <u>must include an original title</u>. DO NOT title your essay with "Women's History Month Essay" or any similar vague variation.
- A Works Cited page must be included
- Essay entries must be MLA formatted, double spaced, and drafted in 12 point Times New Roman font.
- The maximum length of each essay submission is 750 words, not including the Works Cited page.

#### **HOW WILL THE ESSAYS BE JUDGED?**

- Adherence to topic
- Appropriateness of subject
- Creative approach
- Effectiveness of Organization
- Clarity of writing and explanation
- Use of detail and descriptive language
- Standard use of grammar, punctuation, and spelling
- Judges will be scoring the essays using a rubric scale based on the judging criteria listed above
- Judges' decisions are final. If no manuscript meets award criteria in a given year, no award will be granted that year.
- Winners will be determined based on participants earning the top three scores
