

WEATHER RELATED CLOSINGS AND DELAYED OPENINGS

BHPCNS follows Montgomery County Public Schools, MCPS, and emergency weather closings.

If MCPS schools are closed, BHPCNS will be closed.

If MCPS has a two hour delay, BHPCNS will begin the school day at 11:00 am, except for Early Morning with Bradley Bear students who may arrive at 10 am. Students in the 2 year old program may come at 11:00 am and stay until 12:30 pm. We will provide a hearty snack. 2 year old children will be dropped off and picked up from their classrooms.

If MCPS closes schools early, BHPCNS will close at 11:30 for the 2's and 12:30 for the 3's and 4's. Lunch Bunch and Stay and Play will be cancelled.

VISION AND HEARING SCREENINGS FOR BHPCNS STUDENTS:


Hearing Screenings: For all 3 and 4 year old classes will begin January 27th and be wrapped up in February by a licensed audiologist.


Monday: The Artist Corner

Mrs. McCullough Reports:

LET IT SNOW!! We will be making art with the elements, cutting and painting snowflakes. Hopefully we don't get so much that school is cancelled.

Chief Scientist Mrs. Cardoni Reports:

The Bradley Bear scientists really enjoyed our unit on Aerodynamics. In January we will be moving to a new unit on the five senses. We'll start with taste and learn how different spots on the tongue determine whether something is sweet, salty, sour or bitter. Week two will be focused on our sense of smell. We'll blindfold the children and see if they can guess what's in the jar. The third week will be touch. They will use only their hands to determine the shape of various objects in a bag. When we get to the last week in January, we will learn about our sense of hearing by playing a game where the children are once again blindfolded and have to point to the direction where the sound came from. Each week we will also talk about how we use many of our senses together and how removing one from the mix, can change our thought process. The first week of February will cover our sense of sight and end the senses unit.

Happy New Year! We are so proud of all of our dancers and their performance in the Nutcracker and the Freeze Dance Finale! They did a lovely job and I hope they all had fun

In January, it's back to basics for the stay and play dancers. We will review all of the positions and continue to add on to our lexicon of dance vocabulary covering a variety of dance styles. We will explore balance and directionality such as high, low, and side to side. In the spirit of winter, we will try some improv with large snowflake props and imagine how a snowflake falls. We will continue to build healthy muscles and minds now and throughout the year.

Chef Myers Reports:


Bonne année 2017! Wednesday's chefs are visiting Paris this January, preparing and cooking a variety of breakfast items. On our menu this month are scrambled eggs and toast with butter or jelly, crepes with Nutella and bananas, chocolate croissants and oatmeal with fresh fruit and freshly squeezed orange juice. We will practice sequencing and measuring while reinforcing safe cooking techniques. Cooking is a great venue to introduce vocabulary, develop fine motor skills and practice table manners while having fun!





Thursday Where in the World is Bradley Bear Mrs. Skoff Shares: The children spent their December in the beautiful country of Cuba. We had so much fun dancing, singing and eating like Cubans. We will board a "plane" for our next adventure: Antarctica. We will stay on this virtually uninhabited continent for the next three weeks. Did you know that not only does Antarctica have the highest elevation of all the continents but it is considered a desert with annual precipitation of only 8 inches along the coast and far less inland? We will learn about all of the animals that inhabit this vast area and do an experiment that will teach us how their blubber allows them to survive.

Ms. Allen Shares: January offers our Fun Fridays group opportunities inside and out to explore! We will discuss why our days are short but already getting longer, and go out to discover shadows. We will look at the shadows of trees, play equipment, and ourselves! With the help of some sidewalk chalk we will trace our shadows and see how they change as the afternoon wears on. Even if we don't have "real" snow, we will work together to create an indoor snowman, work on some individual abstract snow art, and even have a snowball toss! So "bundle up" for winter fun!

Music with Mr. Chip 2s, 3s, & 4s

Mr. Chip Reports:

Brrr...it sure got cold in December. In order to make the most of the cold weather, many classes practiced ice skating with paper plates in class. This activity is fun and easy to do at home and also provides a great opportunity to work on some gross motor skills while being forced to move more slowly (ideal for indoor days!) We also began learning a line dance that involves coordinating movements with a partner as well as moving independently and within a large group. It was rather fun, and we will continue to practice it next month. Also, in January, we will begin transitioning from our food oriented fall curriculum to Little Hands' new story based curriculum, Sing Me A Story! We will sing about my friend Lucy, who lives at the library and goes on adventures with the books, play along to a jazzy version of Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star, and dance in different ways to Jim Along Josie. If we have time we will also follow guided movements to Eric Satie's beautiful piece, Trois Gymnopedie #1. We have a lot to do, and I can't wait to be back making music with your children soon!

Mrs. Sutherland Reports:

The interesting properties of magnets and magnetism will be our focus in Science this month. We will discover what kinds of objects magnets stick to and whether or not they can work through different materials, such as paper and water. We will also learn that all magnets have two strong places (poles) that create push and pull forces. A lot of hands-on activities and games are incorporated in this lesson. The children are sure to have fun exploring many different types of magnets!

Creative Movement 2s, 3,s & 4s

Mrs. Stevens Reports:

In Creative Movement this month the teachers will be assessing the children's gross motor skills in preparation for the upcoming Parent-Teacher conferences. Different age groups will be working on different skills. Some examples include hopping on one foot, walking backwards, skipping, galloping, hitting a target, as well as following directions. We will asses most of these skills while doing the freeze dance. Next we will clap hands along with the music to the happy dance. Finally we will do the beanie bag dance. The children will practice their directional skills while they toss and catch their bean bags.

Mrs. Cardoni Reports:

In December we finished our lesson on food. In January we will review everything we learned (colors, numbers, food, family) and start our new lesson on body parts. We will learn several new songs including Mi Cuervo (My Body) and Cabeza, Hombros, Piernas, Pies (Head Shoulders Knees (Legs) and Toes (Feet)). Feliz Año Nuevo (Happy New Year)!
