Attention AACA Members Attending Annual Meeting: Special Message and Information Regarding the Annual Meeting & Super Bowl Parade

Most of you have probably heard by now that the City of Philadelphia will be hosting a parade **THIS THURSDAY** to honor the 2018 Super Bowl Champion Philadelphia Eagles. The parade will begin at Broad and Pattison in South Philadelphia, then head north to the Art Museum. It's expected to begin around 11 a.m.

There will be several downtown streets closed to accommodate the parade and you should expect heavier than normal traffic in and around the Philadelphia area. The following streets near the Downtown Sheraton will be closed from 5 a.m. to approximately 6 p.m.:

- Benjamin Franklin Parkway between 16th Street and 20th Street (including Logan Circle)
- 17th Street between Arch Street and Vine Street
- 18th Street between Arch Street and Vine Street
- 19th Street between Arch Street and Vine Street
- Race Street between 20th Street and Logan Circle
- 20th Street between Race Street and Callowhill Street

The **GOOD** news is that the entrance to the Downtown Sheraton and it's parking garage will **NOT** be affected! You **WILL** be able to get to this year's Annual Meeting at the Downtown Sheraton.

As mentioned above, please plan for extra travel time because of the heavier than normal traffic. We think the best way to get to the hotel will be to take the Broad St/15th Street Exit on 676 and make an immediate right and then another quick right to Spring Street, which may look like an alley. At the end of Spring Street you will see the hotel right in front of you.
