Did you do anything for The Great Big Green Week? At my own WI in Bawtry we made some bug hotels at our September meeting and one of our member's husband made us some bat and bird boxes and also an owl box. The bat and bird boxes and bug hotels we donated to our local primary school for the children to decorate. We also contacted the local council who agreed to put some of the bat boxes up in the local ancient woodland that they manage (Kings Wood). The owl box was made especially for one of our members who had always wanted one! See our photos later in this edition.

2021 is the UK's big climate year. The Great Big Green week was organised by the climate coalition and NFWI was one of its partners in this event. It was the largest event for climate and nature ever seen in the UK and was an event to prepare for the COP26 summit in Glasgow later this year. It hoped to encourage local communities to take action to tackle climate change, protect green spaces and connect with nature. The climate emergency and nature affect each other and wildlife is struggling to survive. One of the ideas behind The Great Big Green Week was to encourage local communities to get involved supporting wildlife. Climate change can be a scary topic for some children, but we hoped that by donating items to support wildlife habitats, that the children would feel like they were making a difference. 

FUTURE NEWSLETTERS



RECIPE CORNER

This recipe was sent in by Janine Lishman-Peat of Thurlstone & Millhouse Green WI

Chicken and Spinach Terrine with Lemon

Serves 4

2 chicken portions, cubed 150g baby spinach Grated rind and juice of 1 lemon 2 eggs 120g fromage frais, quark or cottage cheese Salt and pepper

Method

Line a 2lb loaf tin with baking paper. Put everything in a food processor and process until fairly smooth. A few lumps is fine. Put the mix in the tin and bake at 180 c for 40 minutes. Drain off the liquid and leave the loaf until cold. Serve in slices with salad.
