### City Departments Acknowledge Accomplishments of 2021

During the annual end of year and cross-trained in all positions. budget hearings in front of City Council, city department heads spoke in regards to the various accomplishments they saw in 2021 and the progress made in each division. Listed are a few of the highlights:

Painesville City Fire Department completed over 1,000 man-hours of professional development training, officer development and fire investigator training. PCFD is on pace to 4,200 complete emergency responses in 2021, back to prepandemic numbers.

• Painesville Police Department was able to hire seven new police positions in 2021. They also purchased a new prisoner transport vehicle with the capacity to transport up to 13 prisoners and a Polaris Ranger ATV for patrolling downtown. The Painesville Intersection Camera System is nearing completion in preparation for 2022.

• The Engineering Department entered into a public partnership agreement with the Army Corps of Engineers on the Bank Street Retaining Wall which will begin construction in 2022. Skinner Ave and Button Ave waterline replacement and resurfacing were completed, as well as North State Street, despite many logistical obstacles. Design work was started for Chester Street and Reed Ave which are slated for resurfacing in 2022 along with Chestnut Ave and Newell Street.

• The Public Works Department the construction saw and completion of a new city salt dome housing approximately 2,000 tons of salt. With easier access, enhanced lighting and security cameras, city plows are ready to battle any conditions during the winter season and are in full compliance with EPA and Storm Water standards. The department also hired several new employees and has set up a process to ensure that all staff are sufficiently trained

• The Economic Development Office saw some major projects come to fruition in 2021. The Signature Health Painesville Medical Campus, a \$6 million investment, is projected to open by end of year, adding 50 new jobs and \$3 million in new payroll to the city. Avery Dennison announced the expansion of their Chester Street facility, adding 30 new jobs and \$1.8 million in new payroll. The Office was also instrumental in securing grants including the \$1 million Vibrant Communities Grant through Jobs Ohio for Victoria Place and an environmental clean-up grant for \$350,000 at 735 S State Street for future development on the site.

• City Communications had a busy year with the completion of a website redesign, launching in June 2021. Since the launch, mobile visitors are up 86% and desktop visitors are up 65%. Social media remains a strong outlet for information distribution. In August 2021, City Communications was recognized at the 2021 Lake County APEX awards, taking home silver for print newsletters and gold for the Painesville Hometown video.

• The Community Development worked Department on redesigning zoning permits to streamline the process and allow permits to be filled electronically via www.painesville.com/permits. Both of the two full-time housing inspector position were filled in February/March 2021. Since then, inspectors have handled over 4,100 complaints, inspections or re-inspections of properties.

• Under our Public Lands & Recreation Division, the Recreation Department worked creatively to adjust programs and events to current and everchanging COVID-19 restrictions. The installation of two new futsal courts in Kiwanis Recreation Park was a great addition to the park's free amenities. The Cemeteries Division continues to work on opening a new division at Riverside Cemetery, grading the area this year and bring in topsoil and seed next year. Staff averages 200 burials at Riverside each year as the cemetery continues to grow.

The employee Human Resources Department successfully negotiated three-year terms for the seven collective bargaining agreements in the city. The department conducted three civil service exams for the Police Department and two civil service exams for the Fire Department. 22 full-time positions were filled and two part-time positions were filled. 20 employee departures occurred due to either retirements or resignation.

• The Water Division was able to complete major improvements at the Painesville Water Plant including repairs to filter #6, the completion of the new carbon feed building, structural repairs to the building, window replacements, repairs to the security gate and capping off the old raw water intake in Lake Erie. Complete water line replacements occurred on Button Ave. Skinner Ave and Sterling Ave.

• The Electric Division had a busy year as the Smart Meter program continues. 95% of residential meters have been replaced, with commercial and industrial meters left for install. New wire installation occurred on Shamrock Blvd to Brookstone Blvd for the H10 circuit expansion. New customers continue to be added to the system via the development of Encore Estates, Clover Senior Apartments and Community Lane.

• The Water Pollution Control Plant completed many plant improvements including the rebuilding of the #3 primary clarifier, replacement of hypochlorination piping, new grit screw wear bards, a new belt filter press sludge pump and the replacement of the perimeter security fence facing N State Street.





• There is an automatic parking ban when two inches of snow falls within 24 hours. • Keep your snow on your own

• While the City plows the streets, it's the property owner's responsibility to shovel snow on any sidewalk abutting their property. In general, sidewalks should be shoveled within 24 hours after the

final snowfall. After heavy snow fall. the City's Parks Department will plow sidewalks around the schools and major roadways for students and residents.

• Make sure you keep fire hydrants unblocked. It's the property owner's responsibility to keep them uncovered. This allows our Fire Department to quickly and effectively access water in case of an emergency, saving precious time.

Insurance companies are not required to let beneficiaries know that they are mentioned in a policy so many people are not even aware that someone left them money. This is one of the reasons why, more than \$2 billion in insurance proceeds remains unclaimed.

Searching for a policy will take some investigative skills on your part. Here are some ideas to

Take advantage of policy locators. While there is no national data base for insurance policies, the National Association of Insurance Commissioners provides a free website that is a good place to begin. Go https://eapps.naic.org/lifeto policy-locator/ to use the policy finder tool. If you think the policy may have been purchased in Canada, try contacting the Ombudservice for Canadian

Search reputable websites. Insurance companies are supposed to reach out to beneficiaries when the policyholder dies, but sometimes they cannot track down the right people. After a period, they turn the benefits over to the state's unclaimed property program. Missingmoney.com or unclaimed.org may provide some answers. Both organizations match people up with money that may be owed to them from various sources.

The executor of a person's estate

The deceased's next of kin

# Lake County Free Clinic Plans Permanent Home

Clinic has made helping the community a priority, providing medical and dental care at no cost to adults and children who are uninsured or underinsured.

Now, as the premier free clinic in northeast Ohio, Lake County Free Clinic needs the community's help.

In early 2022, LCFC will be moving into a new permanent location in central Painesville from which to provide comprehensive primary and specialty medical care, dental care, case management, labs, prescriptions, referrals for vision and specialty care, supplies and education. To do that, LCFC is launching "Building for a Healthier Community," a capital campaign to raise \$615,000.

"This is definitely one of the biggest challenges LCFC has faced in its 50-year history," said LCFC Executive Director

Since 1971, Lake County Free Marty Hiller. "I always say that has worked toward adopting a a strong free clinic is a sign of strong community support, and I am confident that, as they have in the past, the community will help us remain strong for years to come. We are proud to be able to tell the community that we have already raised nearly half of the funds needed for this community investment."

In the middle of the pandemic, LCFC leaders were told that the site where the clinic had operated for more than 15 years had been sold. Since January 2021, LCFC has provided chronic, acute and preventive medical care from much smaller temporary quarters while the clinic's site search team worked diligently to identify a facility that would not only meet the current need but could accommodate the clinic's growing caseload and list of services for many years to come. In the last few years, LCFC

social determinants approach to healthcare, not only identifying the medical or dental concerns of patients but adding a case management program to identify and address other basic needs that could impact their health, such as insufficient food or inadequate housing. This whole-person approach is being adopted by a wide array of healthcare providers and has demonstrated positive and long-lasting health outcomes.

The new facility will allow the clinic to resume its muchanticipated dental services, expand medical care and more fully integrate the case management program. Time is of the essence, Hiller noted.

"Our patients need us," he said. "Thousands of people who don't have medical or dental insurance in Lake and surrounding counties need us. An uninsured person who visits an emergency department is twice as likely to declare bankruptcy in four years -- and if the patient decides to go, there are times the patient does not get the help they need. Emergency departments are great for stabilizing patients in urgent situations. They are not primary care providers. Lake County Free Clinic is."

Philip, a Mentor resident, came to LCFC in late 2020. He was uninsured and worried, because he hadn't had his blood pressure checked in more than a year. At his first visit, his provider found edema and noticed that Philip's blood pressure was reaching levels that could possibly cause a stroke. Philip left with medication and instructions on regaining his health.

By his next visit, he had started on medication, cut back on junk food and began hiking. He is excited for his next follow-up visit and new lifestyle.

"Everyone here is most helpful and friendly," he said, adding that he was grateful to find a place where he could get care without insurance.

In 2020, LCFC provided more than 3,300 medical and dental treatment visits, even while limiting visits for two months due to the onset of the coronavirus pandemic. This year, LCFC is expecting to exceed the number of medical visits provided the year prior to the pandemic. More than 93 percent of patients are uninsured; more than 60 percent of patients have household incomes below 138 percent of the federal poverty level.

"The need for affordable healthcare is part of the larger picture of inequalities affecting many members of our community. This need continues to grow as our neighbors lose insurance coverage or employment," Hiller said. "Free clinics reflect the value a community places on the health of its residents, and the community's generosity is what allows that care to happen."
