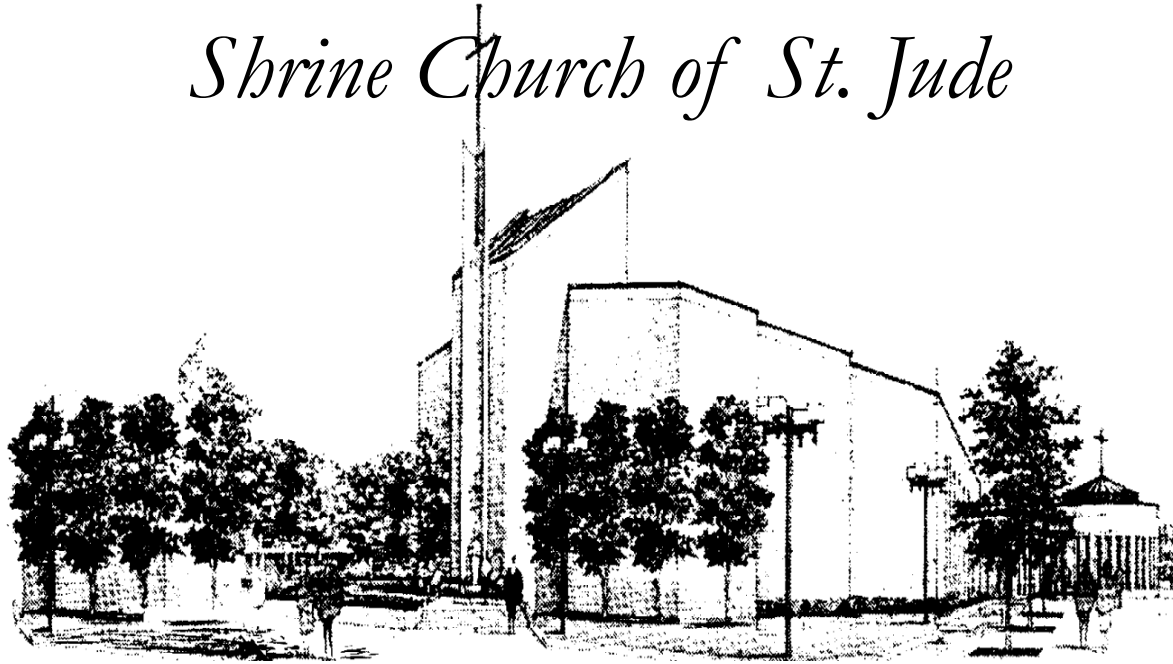

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Each Saturday at the 8:10 a.m. Mass we will celebrate the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Let's have a deeper understanding of this healing sacrament. It is not Last Rite, at the moment of death. As Jesus ministered to the sick, so does the Church. It is for anyone who is seriously sick. So it is intended for those with an ongoing condition (Cancer, Sickle cell, Asthma etc.) those who are going into hospital during the month for an operation, elderly whose health is slipping and those with a mental illness like depression.
