The Tools To Make a Difference

While meeting fellow woodworkers at events and on social media, local woodworker and master carpenter Charlie McKenzie heard about a remarkable teacher who was trying to change the world one person at a time

"He's really trying to make a difference in the world, well, in his world, by teaching young men the trade of carpentry and furniture-making so that they can make a living and keep their families from starving," explained McKenzie.

Shem Viston Taombe lives in Mulanje, Malawi, Africa. He takes on 8 students a year and gives them training in his small woodworking shop on how to do carpentry and build furniture. Taombe has friends in America, Danae and Andy Atkins who have helped him with his school. Andy Atkins, Denver, himself a woodworker saw that Taombe needed tools and contacted fellow woodworkers for donations while he and his wife set up a GoFund-Page called Shem Foundation for cash donations to buy tools and supplies and ship them to Toambe. The goal is to supply every one of these young men with the skills and a few basic tools to begin work. McKenzie heard about their efforts and followed up, eventually making contact online with Taombe.

"I know people hear about scams all the time, but this is not a rip off, this guy is the real deal. This is one man really trying to help young people in his community learn a trade so that they can make a difference. . . .they are dirt poor. . . they had just the crappiest tools available or nothing at all really, so I collected tools and was able through fellow woodworkers I have met over the years and on sites to get, enough donations to send three boxes of tools." Each box cost over \$120 US dollars to mail (US Post) to Malawi. The boxes were mailed last March but came back to West Amana four months later, never having arrived because the borders were closed due to COVID-19 precautions. In June once the borders to Malawi reopened, McKenzie shipped them again.

He found out last week via social media that the tools had arrived and are greatly appreciated by the students and by Taombe who posted photographs of the hand planes, vices and clamps, chisels, wood knives, files, hand saws, hammers, scribes and gauges, measuring tools, hand drills and drill bits,

"They have a few power tools, but really they are trying to do it all with hand tools and they use local tropical hardwoods, so good tools are really like gold. All they had was junk and little of that even. I was thinking our carpenters and woodworkers here used just hand tools and now here are these guys trying to do that as well using primitive tools. They are starting from scratch just like these guys were so long ago. It makes you think how connected we are all really," McKenzie said

To learn more and make a donation go to the Shem Foundation, go to the page on Gofundme created by Danae Atkins. Donations pay for tools, supplies, rent for the workshop and food they distribute in their village. Items they make and are able to sell help raise money too.

Last month the rental home where Toambe and his family live was destroyed by fire but the school continues. Unable to pay to maintain a cell phone Toambe was off social media for some time, McKenzie explained, but through friends in his village he has been able to keep in contact via social media.

Iowa Veterans Benefits: Lifetime Hunting and Fishing License

Hunting and fishing is a cherished past-time for many lowans. The State of lowa provides eligible veterans with a lifetime hunting and fishing license. Lifetime Hunting and Fishing License. Veterans in receipt of at least a 0% disability rating (service connected) can receive a lifetime hunting and fishing license for a \$7.00 fee. In order to qualify the veteran must have served on active federal service and was disabled as a result of that service.


