#### A Word from Rev. Jackson

Greetings in the name of Our Lord Jesus Christ:

As we enter into this new month and arrive at the end of our Lenten season, we are called to contemplate what we have learned or where we have changed over these past few weeks. What has God been showing us? Where could we do better in our service to Him? In what ways are we allowing Jesus's agenda to inform our own?

One of the most touching moments in the passion story is when Jesus is hanging on the cross between two thieves. One thief taunts, but the other one, after confessing his sin, states, "And he said to Jesus, 'Remember me, Jesus, when You come into Your Kingdom.' And Jesus said to him, 'Truly I tell you, today you will be with Me in Paradise." (Luke 23:42-43)

When Jesus gave this blessed assurance to the thief on the cross before he died, He gives a strong message to us as well. That in spite of our failures, sins, mistakes, and shortcomings, Jesus still welcomes us in a spirit of forgiveness into His Kingdom. In other words, if we truly repent of our sin and desire to be with Him, He wants to be with us. In spite of the taunting, negativity, and horror at the cross, a repentant believer comes to faith. Jesus had reason to give up on the human race, yet He receives this spark of life, when death was all around Him. The thief, in his humble plea, receives the promise of eternal life right then and there, on the spot.

This is the kind of God we serve. This is one more example of how extensive His love is. Through this Easter Season and in the post-Easter Season, let's make sure our love and inclusion models what Jesus did on the cross. May the sacrifice of Good Friday and the hope of Easter touch the lives that God will bring across our path.

Your March donations were put to quick use on Laundry Love Night at SudsUp. You donated 12 jugs of detergent, dryer sheets, four hand creams, 12 sanitizers, a large bag of assorted creams, lotions, and soaps, and \$3.25 in quarters for the machines.

While checking in with Rev. Ward, she was asked what was needed as the next season is upon us. Due to warmer weather and high sun for longer outdoor time, she's looking for sunscreen in any size. Individual/trial sizes or larger for moms to use on their families are welcome.

She's also very excited about being a distribution center for the Worcester State Nursing "Baby Box" program. You may have seen a recent article in the paper, and a picture about a similar hospital distribution. The student nurses visit Laundry Love to sign up expectant moms, deliver their baby bed box filled with basic items, and follow their progress for the first three months.

The program of a safe sleep area for newborns originated in Scandinavia and has been successful in helping to prevent SIDS. Rev. Ward is very pleased to be able to be a partner with Worcester State.

"Another FIRST for First Church in Worcester."

That was the often-heard phrase used during 1998, as the long-awaited second steeple arrived from its manufacturer in California. This new steeple was built of

materials compared to that on the Stealth bomber, to house at least three radio antennae. It replicated the first steeple that had been there since the early 1970s, but with the added distinction of being the FIRST church in Worcester to have entered into this new technology.

Omni Point Communications, Inc. was pleased to find that we were the highest point in Tatnuck with an unobstructed availability for a broadcast radius of 1-1/2 to 2 miles. Technology was just bursting on the scene with personal and business cell needs, and our tower was their answer.

2017 finds the steeple standing tall; and the equipment and tower users are constantly updating their product to keep up with the times and demand. Check out the photos in the History Display Case of the raising of the steeple.
