#### **MINUTES**

- **1. Call To Order.** The meeting was called to order at 6:43.
- 2. **Roll Call.** In attendance were Chair Karena Bland, Supervisors Julio Rodriguez and Rafaela Espinosa, District Attorney Vanessa Steinerts, and District Manager Christopher Wallace.

## 3. Approval of Minutes

- **a. September 13, 2018.** Chair Bland moved to approved the minutes, seconded by Supervisor Julio Rodriguez, and, in a voice vote, the minutes were approved.
- **4. Appointment of Vacancy: Seat 2.** This item was postponed until the August 13<sup>th</sup> meeting. The Board wanted Bryan Pasetti to be be present to accept.
- 5. Resolution 2019-1. A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF PEMBROKE HARBOR COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT DETERMINING THE NUMBER OF QUALIFIED ELECTORS IN THE DISTRICT AS OF APRIL 15, 2019. Chair Bland moved to adopt the resolution. Supervisor Espinosa seconded the motion, and, in a voice vote, the resolution was approved. (Resolution approved 3-0).
- 6. Resolution 2019-2. A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF PEMBROKE HARBOR COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT ADOPTING A PROPOSED BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2019-2020 AND SETTING A DATE, PLACE, AND TIME FOR A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED BUDGET. The resolution and budget were briefly discussed and it was suggested that the budget hearing be held on August 13, 2019, at 6:30 p.m., at the Pool Area of Pembroke Cay. Supervisor Espinosa so moved the amended resolution with the date, place, and time as noted. Chair Bland seconded the motion, and, in a voice vote, the resolution, as amended, was adopted. (Resolution approved 3-0).

- 7. Staff Reports
  - a. Manager's Report.
    - i. Reminder To File Form 1 Statement of Financial Interest By July 1<sup>st</sup>. The Board members present were reminded to file their Form 1 by the deadline to avoid penalties.
    - ii. Acceptance of FY2017 audit report. Mr. Wallace noted that this audit was late, but, other than that finding, the auditors had no issues. Chair Bland moved to accept the audit and Supervisor Espinosa seconded the motion. In a voice vote, the audit was accepted. (Audit accepted 3-0).
  - **b.** Attorney's Report. The attorney had nothing to report.
- **8. Audience Comments.** There were no members of the public present.
- **9. Supervisor's Comments.** There were no comments from the Supervisors present.
- **10. Other Business.** There was no other business.
- Adjournment. There being no further business, Supervisor Rodriguez moved to adjourn the meeting and Chair Bland seconded the motion. In a voice vote, the meeting was adjourned at 7:03 p.m.

#### Minutes

- 1. Call To Order. The meeting was called to order at 7:40 p.m. by Chair Karena Bland.
- 2. Roll Call. In attendance were Chair Karena Bland, Supervisor Julio Rodriguez, Supervisor Rafaela Espinosa, District Attorney

Vanessa Steinerts, and District Manager Christopher Wallace. Vice-Chair Helen Porche was absent. Seat 2 remains vacant.

- 3. Approval of Minutes.
  - a. May 31, 2018 Regular Meeting. Supervisor Espinosa moved to approve the minutes. Supervisor Rodriguez seconded the motion. In a voice vote, the minutes were unanimously approved. (Minutes approved 3-0).
- 4. Resolution 2018-3. A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE PEMBROKE HARBOR COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT REGARDING THE PROPOSED BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2018/2019; PROVIDING FOR AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 2018-2 WHICH APPROVED THE PROPOSED BUDGET AND NON-AD VALOREM SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS; AND AUTHORIZED THE SETTING OF THE PUBLIC HEARING DATE FOR PUBLIC COMMENT AND FINAL BUDGET ADOPTION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. Chair Bland moved to approve the Resolution and Supervisor Espinosa seconded her motion. In a voice vote, the Resolution was unanimously adopted. (Resolution Adopted 3-0).
- 5. Public Hearings. Mr. Wallace noted that the following two items were public hearing items. He further noted that he did not see any members of the public present.
  - a. Resolution 2018-4. A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF PEMBROKE HARBOR COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT ADOPTING THE BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2018-2019. Chair Bland moved to approve the Resolution and open the floor to input from the public. Supervisor Espinosa seconded the motion. The floor was open to public comments. There being no one from the public in attendance, the item was closed to public comments. Chair Bland asked if the debt service was the same as last year. Mr. Wallace replied affirmatively. In a voice vote, the Resolution was unanimously adopted. (Resolution adopted 3-0).
  - b. Resolution 2018-5. A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF PEMBROKE HARBOR COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT ADOPTING AND LEVYING AN ASSESSMENT AND ESTABLISHING AN ASSESSMENT RATE FOR BENEFITED PARCELS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2018-2019.

Chair Bland moved to approve the Resolution and open the floor to input from the public. Supervisor Espinosa seconded the motion. The floor was open to public comments. There being no one from the public in attendance, the item was closed to public comments. Chair Bland asked if this was the same assessment rate as the current year. Mr. Wallace relied affirmatively. In a voice vote, the Resolution was unanimously adopted. (Resolution adopted 3-0).

- 6. Staff Reports
  - a. Setting Meeting Schedule For FY2019. A motion was made by Supervisor Espinosa to set the monthly meeting date for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday of each month and to try to have the Landowner's Meeting on November 13<sup>th</sup>. Chair Bland seconded the motion and in a voice vote, the meeting schedule was set. (FY2019 meetings to be held and noticed for the second Tuesday of each month).
  - b. Audit update. Mr. Wallace noted that the audit would be delivered late but that he believed it would be issued by the end of September.
  - c. Election of Supervisors. Discussion was held regarding the Landowner's meeting and notice requirements. District Attorney Steinerts told the Board that she would get back with an answer by the following week.
- 7. Audience Comments. There were no audience comments.
- 8. Supervisor's Comments. There were no further Supervisor comments.
- 9. Other Business. The issue of expanding the District's duties and responsibilities, particularly as they relate to security, was discussed. It was noted by the District's attorney that the City of Pembroke Pines would have to adopt an amending ordinance to expand or contract the Board's powers and duties. The Board directed that this be brought up at the next meeting as an agenda item.
- 10. Adjournment. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:07 p.m.
