Hobbies/what do you enjoy during off-hours?


I enjoy spending time at home where my greatest pleasure is firing up the BBQ and grilling up a great meal.

Looking for Trouble

"Don't go looking for trouble" is the common wisdom, everybody says so, they must be right. Unfortunately, in our line of work, if you don't find trouble first, it will almost always find you. I prefer not to be surprised if I can avoid it.

I first became familiar with the whole concept of Preventive Maintenance while I was in the Navy long ago. Boiled down, it's nothing more than a system for doing all the things needed to look after the equipment in a methodical, orderly and repetitive manner. Not a whole awful lot of sexy about the whole concept unless you can appreciate a ship, car engine, locomotive, factory or building that just hums along. Putting out fires, now that is sexy, keeping the whole thing from ever catching fire, that's just boring. Ever notice how some Building Engineers seem to always be putting out fires?

A couple of the things I learned from the Navy I've practiced daily for the last thirty plus years and they have served me well:

Making the rounds. Do you do a morning rounds? What does it consist of? Engineering rounds on a Minesweeper were done every four hours (even in port!); you walked the ship, took gauge readings, measured tank levels, checked batteries, switchgear, generators, etc. In the world I live in now, my morning rounds have consisted of logging chillers, checking chemicals, cooling towers, air handlers, rooftop equipment, compressors, pumps, fans and most recently, paging through the multiple screens of my various Building Automation Systems. Hint: put some eyeballs -on, don't just go by what the computer tells you. And don't just robotically write down the readings without stopping for a minute to understand what they are trying to tell you! I've also learned to skip the morning rounds only at my peril when something I should have caught comes back to bite me in the butt; if I'm rushed, I do the RULE OF TWOS (more on this another time). Morning rounds are basically the gateway drug to take you into a full-blown PM system addiction (similar to how a newspaper is history's first draft): don't stop until you have a systematic way of checking/maintaining 100% of ALL EQUIP-MENT on a regular basis (daily, weekly, monthly, semi -annually, annually, five year, etc.) throughout your entire facility. Occasionally shake it up, check at night, weekends, etc. for a different view. And keep records, which brings me to:

Logging. I feel lucky that when I first got into this line of work (back in '85 at the byootiful Wyndham Hotel) that the Chief Engineer was an old Navy hand who brought some of his bad habits with him. Young introduced another old Navy tradition of doing regular logs, every four hours, when whoever was on duty would fill out any events that happened on his shift; this was our history. In June of '88, after getting my first building, I adopted the daily log habit. My logs include: all major PM work, contract work (including company, tech and job), meetings (including who was there, what was discussed), major equipment issues (including cause and correction), construction, projects, major equipment installations, unusual weather events (heavy rain, hail, freezes, heavy storms, etc.), parts runs, major materials used and whatever else I think may need recording. Like any other daily discipline, the results are not obvious immediately, but over time. The ability to have a chronological narrative of my facility has helped me tremendously over the years: when was certain work done, who did it, what was the particular sequence of events, was this a weather-related breakdown, when were meetings held all help (along with invoices, work tickets, reports, etc.) to weave a complete picture of how we got to where we are now and help set a guidepost to the future.

Many thanks to Art Martinez and all the SAABE members who dug into their pockets at the last General Membership meeting to make the dream of a cruise a reality for Lee Cantu and his wife. Our prayers are with you both.




