June 4, 2018**

The regular meeting of the De Tour Village Council was held on Monday, June 4, 2018 at 7:00pm in the De Tour Village Memorial Hall. Board members present were President Murray Fountain, Joe Hudak, Marilyn McGuire, Fred Payment, Jen Postula, David Rhinard, Gordon Usher and Jeremy Vredenburg. Jeff Galarowic and Bob Trudo were in attendance.

A motion was made by Jeremy Vredenburg and supported by Joe Hudak to approve the minutes of the regular meeting held on May 7, 2018 as presented.

Economic Development – EDC President Robert Bloch announced to Council after 12 years working with the government officials, De Tour State Marina, will have a custom border check station. De Tour along with Drummond Island and Mackinac Island where the only ones to receive the check points. EDC will do a market campaign with our Canadian neighbors.

Festivals – Independence Day plans are underway. The pavilion will have an upgrade of power and lighting. Riverfest is in planning stage for the first weekend in August, exciting new events are planned for the festival. Memorial Day Salute was a success, approximately 70 people attended the service.

Finance – Treasurer Jen Postula reported to council the Village received 2% funding for the ambulance equipment in the amount of \$18,843.30. The Village also received millage from Raber Township,
