INTRODUCTION TO THE DAY

Welcome to the first in a series of four services in a series called *A Branch Raised Up*. Today we highlight Jeremiah 33:15—"I will cause a righteous branch to spring up"—and relate that verse to Christ who came to raise up our fallen race by covering us with his righteousness that we might be saved and grow in him. But now we are released from the law, having died to that which held us captive, so that we serve in the new way of the Spirit and not in the old way of the written code.
