


Advent is a season of joyful expectation. During Advent, each Sunday's Gospel reading has a specific focus. The Old Testament readings, especially those taken from Isaiah, are prophecies about the Messiah and messianic times. The selections from the writings of the Apostles present exhortations and instructions on different themes of this season.



# Exploring our Faith

# ADVENT WAITING

You may have grown up thinking of the Season of Advent as that four-week sprint just before Christmas. Or, maybe you thought of it as the appetizer whose sole purpose was to get you to the main course—Christmas! When you're a kid waiting for presents (present company included), four weeks of Advent can seem like an eternity. To say that the Season of Advent is four weeks long is liturgically correct albeit a bit short-sighted. The Reign of God broke into the world in the most definitive and subversive way on that first Christmas 2000 years ago, yet the Reign of God is still on the way. Christ has come, but Christ still needs to come.

If that's true, then we are Advent people all year round. Staying awake for the signs of Jesus's Second Coming should be our everyday posture 365 days of the year and not just for four weeks. We say as much, do we



not, each time we gather for Eucharist? At each Mass, the presider says, "The mystery of faith." One of the assembly's responses is this (note the ending): "We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection **until you come again**." Another response goes like this (note the ending): "When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim your Death, O Lord, **until you come again**." These refrains can only fall from the lips of Advent people. They are little reminders that when Jesus returns in glory, there will be no need to eat this Bread nor drink from this Cup, anymore. But, we're not there yet. We still have to gather. We still have to eat. We still have to drink. So, how *do* we get there? How *do* we wait?

We wait for the Second Coming of Jesus by taking our cues from those who waited for His First Coming. The prophets in Biblical times

had to keep the embers hot. They had to give hope to people, over centuries, that the Messiah was coming, a new reign would break upon the land and last forever. Because it was hard to keep the edges hot, many gave up hope. However, a small group, a remnant, never gave up hope. They are referred to as the "faithful remnant of Israel." Here is how they waited and how we are called to wait as well.

1) Wait with a sense of promise. God, through Angel Gabriel, promised Elizabeth and Mary that each would bear a child. God's promise would be fulfilled. We can only wait for what is already growing within us. If you're not pregnant, you have no need to wait. But, if you are pregnant, the anticipation, I'm told, is all-consuming. Similarly, a farmer waits for his planting to bear fruit. Trust that what you are waiting for right now is, in some way, already present to you, although not full revealed.

2) Wait actively. You know something is happening. Passive waiting means it's out of your hands, and you are simply punching in time. However, a patient person remains still knowing the real thing isn't always tomorrow; it's right here today. Fear makes us run. The angel says to Mary and to us, "Do not be afraid."

**3) Wait open-ended.** This is the difference between wishing *for* something versus hoping *in* something. Wishing says, "This is what I wish for, and it must unfold according to my agenda or I will be very disappointed." Hope is feeling confident that God's plan will be fulfilled according to God's promises. Let go of wish lists. Hoping says, "Let it happen to me according to your will." I don't try to control the situation. I try, instead, to be formed by God's life-giving will rather than by my own fears.

4) Wait together. Mary and Elizabeth are cousins who sought each other out and helped each other to wait. Each reminded the other of the promise the angel had made and that what they were waiting for would be fulfilled. This is what we owe each other as member of the Church. My job is to remind you that God's promise is growing in you--so stay close to it—even, and especially, on your worst day. Similarly, your job is to remind me, especially in moments of discouragement, that God's promise is growing in me and will come to fruition soon. Although we call Pentecost the "birth of the Church," I think Mary and Elizabeth's waiting together was the real, but "unofficial" birth of the Church."

If we wait with a sense of promise, actively, open-ended, and together, Christmas will come of its own accord. And not only that, it will be more fulfilling than anything we could put on our wish list.



## FINANCIAL REPORT



Father Angus and your Finance Council members would like to take this opportunity to provide a church financial summary for the nine months ending September 30, 2021. Our church has done well in this exceptionally challenging COVID-19 period, and our parishioners' generosity is a big part of this success. Our council thanks you for your denerous donations.

The bank account balance was \$331,600 on September 30, 2021 compared to \$147,500 on September 30, 2020, an increase of \$184,100. We sold the rectory for \$300,000, and the church received \$296,700 after expenses. We spent \$179,500 on the first three geothermal project instalments.

Taking those two one-time revenue and expense items out of the bank balance, the balance increased \$66,900 in the year.

Total revenue for the first nine months in 2021 was \$254,100 compared to \$227,500 in 2020, an increase of \$26,600. There were increases in four main areas: envelope collection \$2,600; pre-authorized payments \$14,645; building fund \$6,300; and donations without parish envelopes \$6,200.

The federal government's Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy Program provided the church with \$17,300 in revenues in 2021 and \$22,100 in 2020, a decrease of \$4,800. This government program, which has averaged \$2,495 per month for the last 19 months, ended October 31, 2021.

Total expenses year-to-date were \$225,800 compared to \$212,200 in 2020, an increase of \$13,600 or 6.4%. The main expense increases: offices expenses \$3,200 (\$2,763 of this increase was for a new vault in the new office), maintenance \$6,200 (including expenses related to the office move: \$1,458 for WiFi wiring, \$1,197 for new office mold treatment, and \$535 for new mower) and repairs \$3,700 (boiler repairs).

Net income was \$28,200 in 2021 compared to \$15,300 for 2020, an increase of \$12,900 or 84.3%.

#### MAJOR CAPITAL EXPENDITURES / FUNDRAISING

There is a delay in the arrival of a major piece of equipment for the geothermal project, which will move the system start date to mid-January. Almost all of the energy-efficient LED lighting has been installed; there are a few small issues that will be addressed in the next few months. Our next major project will be the removal and replacement of the front steps. The church Building Committee is in the process of getting new quotations for the work and a sample drawing. Our goal is to start this work in summer 2022; however, we will only start the project if we have the funds. Our parish fundraising campaign has raised \$73,900 to date. save our planet and ensure a healthy and favorable environment for all people. This committee will let us know its plan for education and action early in the new year. #### **People and Planet First**

## Thank you for putting People and the Planet First by signing petitions.

A major focus of Development and Peace — Caritas Canada's People and Planet First campaign is advocating for a law that compels Canadian companies to respect the human and environmental rights of local populations in their overseas operations. This fall, acting in solidarity with their brothers and sisters in the Global South, thousands of Canadians signed a petition asking the government to enact
