GSPCI Honorary Life Member Patti Keller passes away. - Charlie Edwards

Patti Keller died last month after a lengthy illness due to congestive heart failure. Patti had been a member of GSPCI for many years though not active for in the club for some time due to her health. Patti founded Huntabird Kennels after moving to Indiana from Michigan in the early 70's. Many people know of Patti because of the successes of her dogs in the show ring but the dogs she and her first husband originally bought were strictly for hunting and it was only after her divorce that she became involved in conformation. Many of the dogs she bred were sold to companion education and a gift for recognizing and developing quality animals. In the early 70's, many GSP's being shown were coarse looking and didn't move very well. Patti bred dogs that had clean, elegant lines and moved effortlessly which drew the attention of GSP fanciers around the country. Patti really made an impact on the breed with Flash (Ch. Huntabird's Main Reason). Flash is still the youngest shorthair in the history of the breed to win a Best in Show which he did at 15 months. Flash went on to become one of the top producing sires in the breed of show champions along with a number of master hunters and obedience titled dogs. In 2004 Patti and Flash were both inducted into the German Shorthaired Pointer Club of America Hall

of Fame. Patti was the first person inducted into the Hall of Fame.

You say "why should I care about what Patti Keller did. I don't show dogs, I just like to hunt" Well hopefully you can appreciate that someone worked to develop GSPs that were well built so they wouldn't break down at an early age, were of sound temperament while still maintaining a good nose for birds and looked good doing it. You really can have show dogs that can hunt regardless of what some people like to say. It just depends on what your priorities are. The dogs that Patti bred are still having an impact on many dogs being bred and shown today. Patti mentored many judges and breeders and her influence will be long remembered by those who were fortunate enough to have known her.

Recap on Karl Kelly Conservation Officer's Youth Camp – by Steve Hammond

GSP of Indiana put on dog demo again at Lafayette youth camp. Dogs were put through their paces by handlers Tim, Casie, Clynnt, & Donna Conley, and Steve Hammond. Tim did a little background on the breed, and introduced the dogs to Hammond then helped several of the newer members the group. Tim was his usual self in doing the narrating as Casie put Argo thru his show routine, all eyes where on Argo.

> Next up was Casie and Molly for a little demonstration in obedience training which went off without a hitch. For those not familiar with this program these are boys and girls in the twelve and thirteen year age range. They have a lot of different programs they go thru in their week of attendance. The programs are all outdoor related (ie. archery, gun safety & shooting, fishing, rock climbing, bird dog demo, etc.). All this is done while being a member of team. There were four teams with 35-40 kids each. Discipline is a major issue, with the offending parties often times doing push-ups.

> For our demos they combined two groups. We had an hour for each group, to do our thing. Back to the demo, after the obedience and letting some of the spectators try their hand at the show ring with Argo and Chief we moved on to showing some of our training tools.

First off we had a demonstration of the e-collar. Sometimes it is hard to get volunteers for this part, but after a little, alright a lot of pleading we got a couple of boys willing to take one for the team.

Up next was THE WINGER-ZINGER, which was a big hit. Of course any time you throw something thirty feet in the air and into a pond it looks exciting, especially when a dog retrieves it. Pigeons are also another audience grabber. Whether you put one to sleep or launch it from bird launcher it gets attention. Buford on point with Chief and Otter backing was also a big hit, especially when you launch a bird and no dogs move. Even the people in charge are impressed when you pull this off. Like I mentioned before launching bumpers into pond and having different dogs do water retrieves was liked by all.

Last but not least was the duck drag, track around the pond, retrieve back across. Argo executed this, no problem.

All in all it went great again. Next year we need
