


Exploring our Faith

THE FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption of Mary. In 1950 Pope Pius XII defined Mary's Assumption into heaven as dogma of Roman Catholicism: "The Immaculate Mother of God, the ever-Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heaven."

As a child growing up in the 50's and 60's, Mary was always an integral part of my religious upbringing. In May we took our bicycles to school for the Queen of the May parade, when our bicycles would be blessed by our parish priest. When I was confirmed, I chose the name "Mary" as the name added to my baptized name. I remember looking at the statue of Mary and thinking there was space for me under her cloak; her heart was full of tenderness towards all her children. It is my understanding that Mary walks with us always; she is with us during our struggles and triumphs. We can lift up our hearts to Mary because she, like a Mother, is always there with open arms. We can celebrate a time of repose when we can contemplate her beauty; a time of consolation when we look to the reward that Mary enjoys and that we hope for ourselves.



The beautiful words of the Magnificat "My soul magnifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God, my Saviour, for He has looked with favour on the lowliness of His servant.....the Mighty One has done great things for me and holy is His name." She was filled with joy that God had chosen her. Her words are evidence of the purity of her soul. Mary's heart desired nothing but to please the Lord. Richard Rohr said, "The language of Mary is the language of allowing, receiving, surrendering, trusting." The feast of the Assumption points to the final reward for a life of holiness by which, with Mary's special prayers and unfailing help to merit God's grace, we may arrive safely in the Father's home.

Mother Teresa said: " Pray especially to Our Blessed Mother Mary placing all your intentions into her hands. For she loves you as she

loves her Son. She will guide you in all your relationships so that peace may fill your life. If you ever feel distressed during your day, call upon our Lady. Just say this simple prayer: 'Mary, Mother of Jesus, please be a mother to me now."

After retiring from teaching, my husband and I have had the opportunity to travel overseas. We have visited many European sites, including a number of Churches. In each Church there is a statue of Mary, whose image always seems to show a beautiful woman in a flowing cape; a recognizable figure representing grace, humility, and abounding love. I have a prayer card from one of these churches which I recite each night. It reads: "May we be assisted, we beseech Thee, O Lord, by the worshipful intercession of Thy glorious Mother, the ever Virgin Mary; that we who have been enriched by her perpetual blessings, may be delivered from all dangers, and through her loving kindness made to be of one heart and mind; who livest and reignest world without end. Amen."

Let us remember, honour, and be grateful to Mary on the Feast of Her Assumption.

Attending Mass

Please arrive 15 to 30 minutes prior to Mass to allow for check in and seating Some restrictions have been eased as to numbers allowed to gather with continued awareness of social distancing. You must call the parish office at 857-4223 Monday to Friday to reserve your place at Mass. (Deadline to reserve for weekend Mass is Friday at 12:00noon). Please note: you must register for weekday Mass also. To register for Mass at Our Lady of Mercy please call Odette at 531-0252 or Mike at 351-4263. We will continue the original weekday Mass schedule.

Please follow these guidelines:

In the parking lot, stay safely 6 feet apart.

At the church entrance, stop and allow the volunteer to check you in.

Inside the door, stop and you will be given hand-sanitizer (your hands will be 'squirted')

Inside the church, follow the volunteer to your assigned seat

During Mass, follow all arrows and markings on the floor, so we all stay safely 6 feet apart

During Mass, enjoy the Music Ministry, Hum along, but for now, no singing.

After Mass, respect the safety of keeping the 6 feet between you and your fellow parishioners while leaving the building and when out in the parking lot.

Changes at Mass

A volunteer will bring you to you pre-assigned seat(s)

There will be one Lector for all readings, the lector will be seated in Sanctuary

There will be no alter servers and no singing

We will wish each other the peace of Christ by nodding, smiling, bowing, waiving

We will be silent when receiving Holy Eucharist

Please know that before each Mass, every pew, railing, door handle and all bathrooms will be cleaned and sanitized

Please make sure you take all of your belongings with you when you leave

Dispensation from Mass During this pandemic, the dispensation of Sunday Mass is given to those who can not go, those fearful to go, and those advised not to go, to church. Rather, these faithful are invited to read the Word of God and to pray in their homes and to participate in the celebrations of the Mass via TV, radio and/or the Internet. Those who are sick (fever, cough, etc), those over the age of 70 and those with medical or at-risk conditions are asked to assess their own risk and ultimately, to make their own decision. Masks are not mandatory, but we encourage everyone to wear his or her own mask. When you are sitting in your pew, safely 6 feet away from others, you can certainly remove your mask, for your comfort.

Thank you to all our volunteers!! Our church must be disinfected following every liturgy; there must be a person checking people in and having them answer the Covid-19 questions; there also needs to be someone just inside the door supplying all in attendance with hand sanitizer; and finally, there must be volunteers inside the church escorting people to their seats in a manner that respects social distancing. 
