#### In Need Of Christ The True King

Christ instituted the Church, among others, to be a light unto the nations of the world, and to direct all God's children and lead them back to God. And this, the Church has never failed to do over the years. Let's think of Russia for example.

Tradition holds that St. Andrew the Apostle introduced Christianity to Russia, precisely in the current **Kiev** area. Over the years they embraced the Byzantine rite (one of the many or traditions in the Catholic Church). Historically, the Church played vital roles in the survival of the Russian state, helping her to withstand years of oppression and further expansion both economically and spiritually.

Sadly, the emergent of the Soviet Union, which actually began in 1917, brought with it serious persecution of Christians and the introduction of atheism. The government wanted to remove every possible religious influence from the Soviet society. Beyond that, one of their ideological objectives was the elimination of religion. Thus, when Our Lady appeared to the three children at Fatima in 1917, one of her special requests was for people to pray for the conversion of Russia.

Within the next five years, 28 bishops and 1,200 priests were executed and some 20,000 Christians were executed. History shows that in 1937, alone, 136,900 Orthodox clerics were arrested, and 85,000 of them were shot dead. In 1938, alone 28,300 were arrested and 21,500 of them were shot dead. I recall how we daily prayed for the conversion of Russia for years when I was growing up. It finally happened on the night of November 9, 1989. And our very own Pope John Paul II was so instrumental to it.

I recall all this history because of our celebration today: the Solemnity of Christ the King of the universe. When anyone, any family, any people, or any nation submit to his rule among them, there is true peace, freedom and prosperity. Surely, this should not be understood to mean unending *kumbaya* and endless wealth.

Last Sunday I referenced many cases in which our fellow brothers and sisters (within and outside our country) suffered untimely and unprepared deaths. We recalled and prayed for the victims of the recent terrorist activities of ISIS around the world.

This past week, the international community led by France and Russia zeroed in on Raqqa, ISIS proclaimed Caliphate headquarters. ISIS has declared one of their goals as the founding of an Islamic State to which all Muslims must pledge. Judging by what they're doing now, we can imagine a world with a fully established Islamic state. And who will be the leader? What would be his message? How would "unbelievers" around the world fare under his rule? And by the way, who will be the divine king of this Caliphate? God? The same God we all worship?

I bring up these two narratives to show what happens when we humans don't have Christ in our lives or worse, when we try to eliminate Christ from our lives – be it on a personal level or family, society, or national levels (as was the case of USSR). ISIS and AI Qaeda have become the modern symbols of religion gone amok.

I guess as a Catholic priest I'm already biased because I believe Christ is the Only Son of God (and so, He is God), the only Prophet of God, and King of the world. I believe that if we truly enthrone Him as such, in our lives, in our families, in our communities, in our churches, or mosques, or synagogues, or whatever, we will know peace at all these levels. Sentiments and pride apart, all we need to do is take a closer and realistic look at what He wants of us. What kind of Person and God he is. What examples He has left for us. What demands he places on us. And what powers He wields! I fell like the prophet Elijah, when he challenged the false prophets of Ba'al to a duel to determine the true God – Ba'al or the God of Israel.

Anyhow, that may never come to pass but at least, each of us can help by indeed making Christ the king of our heart, mind, bodies, soul, and families. That will go a long way to convert the world to our true King. -Fr. Raphael Ezeh. MSP
