Pastor's Corner

For this year's Winter Olympics, I got a slow start. For various reasons I didn't watch much in the opening days. BUT I just heard the most amazing story from the field of speed skating! A couple weeks ago (on February 13th), US speed skater Erin Jackson won the women's 500m gold medal, becoming both the first US woman to win a speed skating gold at the Olympics as well as the first Black woman to win an individual medal in speed skating (according to a CNN article by George Ramsay and Patrick Sung) – which is impressive but not what amazed me. The part that "wowed" me was when I learned that in order to be able to do that, her teammate gave up her spot to her. Basically, Jackson would have missed competing, because she slipped during qualifying trials, but – get this – her teammate Brittany Bowe gave up her own spot to ensure that Jackson was able to go to Beijing! Let that sink in ... Think about the amount of time, dedication and sacrifice Bowe must have put into getting to the Olympics to compete ... If you really take that into account, this gesture is remarkable. Yes, Bowe was able to compete in a different event (the 1000m), but to me, it's still one of the most powerful things to come out of an Olympics.

This is what Bowe said in an interview - "Right after the race, I knew that if it came down to me relinquishing my spot for her to be named on the team, I would do that because she deserves it ... She has earned the right to compete in her marquee event at the Olympics, and it was an honor to give her that spot for the opportunity to race for gold for

Team USA" (*Ramsay & Sung, CNN, 2/13/2022*). Jackson, meanwhile, spoke about the "flood of emotions" she experienced when Bowe gave up her spot, adding that "you don't really know what you feel."

Do your best to imagine what that felt like for Jackson – seriously, try ... Okay? Now read what Paul wrote in Romans 5:6ff. – "For while we were still weak, at the right time, Christ died for the ungodly." [A paraphrase could be – "when we had slipped and fallen short, just in time, Christ gave his spot to the undeserving" because the definition of the Hebrew word for "sin" is "to fall short of the mark"]. There's more; Paul goes on: "One will rarely die for another person – though perhaps for a righteous person, one would dare to die – but GOD demonstrates his own love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." To help you and me think about how staggering this is, how extravagant this love is, think of Bowe and Jackson again. Bowe knew that Jackson deserved to be in the Olympics (she said as much), so giving up her spot – as moving and powerful as it certainly is! – is like what Paul says – "I suppose that for a righteous person (i.e., someone who deserved it), one might dare" to sacrifice herself ... But here is the Gospel: God stepped in when we did NOT deserve it ... when, far from earning our place on "his team," we had broken the rules again and again (like an athlete doping with drugs and illegally augmenting our equipment). In our situation, we didn't just "slip" like Jackson, missing qualification by a small margin, we had made a mockery of an institution designed to be noble and bring out the best in all.

And yet [I love the verses in the Bible that begin with the words, "But God ...], even in our totally-NOT-deserving state, Someone "gave us their spot" – "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this," that while we were cheaters (and worse), Christ took our place (and gave us his). As Paul says in 2 Corinthians, "God made [his Son], who knew no sin, to be sin for us, so that in him, we might become the righteousness of God" (5:21). This is what C.S. Lewis called "the great exchange." And what happened between Jackson and Bowe helps me (and I hope it helps you) to see it in a fresh way, a humbling and inspiring way, that produces great gratitude and invigorated faith. Like spiritual speed skating! We've been given a spot in our own "Olympics" (this life we live). This can help us on our Lenten track – to stay in the lane of the cross. In fact, since we have been raised from death, let's not just walk in resurrection life – let's run the good race with all that is within us. Amen.


Crafternoon:

We are about to move into the season of Lent...a time we reflect on the great Love of Christ and how He died to free us from the bondage of our sin. The choir's anthems will reflect that sentiment and, we pray, will open hearts and minds to a deeper relationship with Christ through the lyrics and music. Yes, we are human and yes, we are not always perfect. But God sees our efforts perfectly. We pray our music brings you peace, love, and a deeper understanding of what Christ did for us on His road to Calvary.





A Devotional for You – Read Luke 7:36-50

"I tell you, her many sins have been forgiven—as her great love has shown. But whoever has been forgiven little loves little." (Luke 7:47)

In this story, Jesus interacts with two sinners: the smug Pharisee who lacks basic hospitality, and a sorrowful intruder who lavishes him with expensive perfume and penitent tears. One points an accusing finger, the other crumbles to her knees in humility. The reality is that both sinners—in fact, all sinners—must start at the feet of Jesus, where unworthiness is transformed into complete forgiveness and restoration. Righteousness is not earned but granted by grace alone. Bonny Mulder-Behnia shares, "Our church has picnic tables on the patio, where members often gather to drink coffee after a worship service and—sometimes just hours later—local teens gather to drink alcohol or use drugs. My mission is to extend Christ's love to both groups, with the hope and prayer that they might one day sit together at these tables and share their testimonies of God's amazing grace. Some Christians can have whitewashed memories of the seriousness of their own sin, while seekers just meeting Jesus may feel not good enough. Jesus invites us all to meet at his feet, where our tears and his love flow freely. From that level, we can help one another up to walk together as fellow followers. No one is better than another, and we all must know of our need for the Savior and want to grow in faith."

Let me share another important aspect of this. Matthew 25:40 says, "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." If you read the entire parable in this chapter, you will notice that Jesus links sacrificial hospitality with eternal reward. He goes as far as to say that the way we treat other image-bearers of God is the way we treat God himself. We love God by loving others. We may nod in agreement and then give some money or food to a homeless shelter or a food pantry.

But Jesus specifically says, "You gave me something to eat ... you invited me in ... you clothed me ... you came to visit me." Contributions coupled with personal involvement are a God-honoring combination." There are people in your community today who are feeling neglected and forgotten, especially those whose situations may cause them to feel ashamed. Think of someone struggling with mental health issues, loneliness, abuse, guilt, job loss, financial crisis, marital trouble, or children not walking with God. Ask God to bring someone to your mind, and reach out personally with a card, call, or visit. Consider it a date with Jesus; you might just see him in them, and they may see him in you. God of compassion, give us your heart for people who are not outcasts in your eyes but precious ones made in your image. May we love them, learn from them, and see you in them. Amen.


