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

- <u>Directions:</u> Many of you have been to our home in the past but if you have forgotten, the following are <u>two alternate</u> sets of directions:

<u>Alternate 1--From Hwy 169</u> Turn East on Medicine Lake Rd and proceed for about 5 blocks.

- Turn right (South) on Cavell and go the equivalent of about 3 blocks.
- Turn left (East) on 23<sup>rd</sup> Ave and go the equivalent of about 2 blocks.
- Turn right (South) on Zealand. Ours is the 3<sup>rd</sup> house on the right.

<u>Alternate 2--From Hwy 55:</u> Turn North on Winnetka Ave and proceed about 1 mile.

- Turn left (West) on 23<sup>rd</sup> Ave and go the equivalent of about 5 blocks
- Turn left (South) on Zealand. Ours is the 3<sup>rd</sup> house on the right.

Note: There is still some city-street work being done in our neighborhood but it should not be a problem getting to our street.



We have a recommendation from Randy Gross, one of our club members:

As many may know he is located in California and is considered as the one man who has restored more Model A brake systems then probably anyone else.

Steel drums were originally supplied on the Model A until very late 1931 when cast iron was finally introduced as a superior material to eliminate brake fade, warping and have longer life. Today steel drums are no longer produced, and Randy says he has seen less than a handful of used steel drums that are in tolerance. The replacement cast iron drums with its specified brake shoe lining working together will give you a much safer and a more reliable brake system. It is not recommended to turn steel brake drums on a brake lathe to re true them. After late 1931 Ford dealerships would only supply a cast iron drum as a replacement. The brake system relies on many moving parts and having each component returned to original specifications will give you a safe and reliable stop. A carefully rebuilt braking system with cast iron drums will greatly improve your stopping ability.

# LADY SLIPPERS 2024 WHITEWATER GATHERING

#### **Registration:**

Registration is now open for the 2024 Model "A" Get-together, October 2-6th at the Whitewater State Park Group Camp in southeastern Minnesota. The group camp will open beginning Wednesday, Oct. 2nd at 2:00 p.m. and will close Sunday, Oct. 6th after breakfast and performing the site clean-up.

#### Location:

Take Hwy. 74 north from St. Charles, then turn west on the gravel group camp road at the bottom of the large hill near the south end of the park. Park Headquarters and the RV campground are one mile further north on Hwy. 74.

#### Park Vehicle Stickers:

Required vehicle park stickers must be purchased at park headquarters one mile north of camp. If you trailer your Model "A" you only need to purchase a sticker for the tow vehicle. You will also be given a "towed" vehicle sticker.

#### Where to Stay:

Sleeping cabins are available at the group camp at no extra charge. Just bring a sleeping bag or bedding. A separate shower and modern bathroom building is nearby. State park campground reservations for tents or RVs can be made by calling the DNR at 866-857-2757 or by reserving on line at:

www.dnr.state.mn.us/state parks/reservations.html

Motels are available in Winona and Rochester. (Suggestions on the reverse side of this sheet.)

#### Tours:

Check-in Wednesday afternoon and enjoy Whitewater Park on your own. Organized tours will leave every morning Thursday through Saturday.

#### Meals:

Wednesday's supper will be a campfire meal at the camp dining hall. There will be hot dogs with buns, potato salad, baked beans, chips and fixings for S'mores. It's available from 5:00 p.m. that night, until we put out the fire. Breakfasts and dinners will be provided in the camp dining hall. Mid-day lunches will be at your expense during touring activities. Use of the commercial kitchen for packing lunches is an option, and you are welcome to use the large walk-in cooler for storing your labeled food, favorite beverages and snacks. We always appreciate it if you can bring bars/cookies/treats to share with everyone.

#### Fees:

Registration for Wednesday, October 2nd is \$25 and allows full use of the park for that afternoon. Registration for the next three days is \$50 per day per person, received until Sept 6th, increasing to \$55 per day per person after Sept. 6th. Cost of Sunday breakfast is your help with pick up & cleanup of buildings, cabins, restrooms and grounds we used. These fees don't cover lunch or any tour entrance fees.


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## **National Club Affiliation Information**
