Thus we are waiving all late fees and suspending all water and electric disconnections until we can proceed under normal operations.

#### Changes in Trash/ Yard Waste Pick Up

In order to protect their drivers and employees, Republic Waste has changed some of their procedures as a result of the current Covid-19 pandemic.

- They will accept cart contents only. Drivers will not be authorized to leave their vehicle to pick up waste outside the cart.
- Yard waste and bulk waste collection has been temporarily suspended.
- As an alternative, Republic has provided two bulk waste containers and one yard waste container on Latimore Street before the hill to Rec Park. Any city resident is free to use this. Please no tires, hazardous waste or electronics.

### Grass Violations: Everything You Need to Know

Ever received a grass violation letter? It's not fun. To avoid the headache and fees, here is the complete City of Painesville process on grass violations:

When weeds or grass reaches a height of six inches or higher on any developed, residentially zoned property, and twelve inches or higher on all other lands or lots, the city will send one notice per year via certified and regular mail to the property owner. This one notice covers the entire mowing season.

In this notice, property owners are given seven days to mow. After seven days, a reinspection of the property occurs to see if the lawn has been cut. If not, the city will hire a private contractor to mow and remove the excess vegetation at the property

owner's expense plus the cost of law. Continued violations could inspection.

If the property owner fails to pay the within 30 days, the Finance Director shall certify the fee to the Lake County Auditor to be placed upon the tax duplicate and collected as other taxes are collected according to result in misdemeanor charges.

In summary, the city gives all residents and business owners one warning letter per a year if their grass is too high. Once that letter has been issued, any reinspection of the property that violates the six inch (or twelve inch) rule will result in a fee

(the cost of the inspection plus the cost of the private contractor mowing).

So don't make it a habit! If you are going on vacation, make sure to ask a neighbor to mow your lawn or hire a professional

Evergreen and Riverside Cemeteries will be open for

summer decorations starting Monday, May 18. Painesville cemetery personnel have been working to complete spring clean-up at both cemeteries in time for Memorial Day.

Below are a few reminders while planning decorations:

• Summer decorations are permitted one week before Memorial Day and must be removed by October 1.

• Allowed decorations include potted live flowers in standard clay or plastic pots/urns, no larger than 15 inches. Flower baskets on shepherd's hooks or raised holders are also permitted.

Summer Decorations at the Cemeteries

- No more than one pot, basket or shepherd's hook per grave is permitted.
- Single headstones marking two graves or monument lots may have two pots, baskets or shepherds hooks.

#### · No artificial decorations of any kind are permitted during summer months. This includes silk or plastic flowers, statues, crosses, vigil lights, balloons and wind chimes.

- American flags are permitted year round.
- Mother's Day decorations are allowed up to five days before the holiday and five days

### City Sidewalk Program

2018 City Council In passed the Painesville City Sidewalk Program, a two phase infrastructure improvement plan aimed at improving walkability in the community. During Phase (2018-ongoing), city staff replaced damaged sidewalk slabs that fell under city responsibility and removed any trees in the tree lawn that were deemed hazardous to sidewalks or infrastructure.

Phase 2 (2020-2021), has owners replacing property sidewalk slabs that fall under their responsibility and any trees in the tree lawn that may be deemed hazardous to those sidewalks.

As a result, the city applied for a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) through the Lake County Commissioners Office and was awarded \$50,000 to fund the Disadvantaged Sidewalk Assistance Program for low to moderate income Painesville residents.



At some point, the utility companies will be able to disconnect service. the cost of food will skyrocket, collection activity/harassment will increase dramatically and so will stress caused illness. If you are one of the many people, whose bottom is about to fall out there is still hope. Do not allow yourself to lose your health (or, maybe, even your life over financial stress) because if that happens you will not be able to fix your life. If you are healthy and maintain right thinking you will come out of this OK. I have seen it work thousands of time. ### The Importance of Advance Directives I am not an attorney so please A Living Will which states what are not covered in your living will

do not mistake this for legal advice. However, I believe everyone should put their health care decisions in writing and select a person to act on their behalf, just in case they are ever unable to speak for themselves. You can do this by preparing a set of formal documents referred to as Advance Directives stating your wishes. In most cases, your Advance Directives will include:

life sustaining medical treatments you would want or refuse if your life is in jeopardy and you are unable to express your wishes.

A Health Care or Medical Power of Attorney or Durable Power of Attorney for Health Care which names a specific person to represent you. This document gives this person the rights to:

Make medical decisions that

• Enforce your healthcare

- · Hire and fire doctors and medical workers overseeing your treatment
  - Access medical records

wishes in court if necessary

• Provide visitation rights

Your representative cannot contradict the terms of your Living Will. Also, a physician and a second doctor must both conclude you are unable to make your own decisions before the Medical Power of Attorney goes into effect.

Once you prepare your Advance Directives, it will be up to you to share these documents with your family, your medical team and those who will be entrusted to carry out your directives.

Directives can be revoked or replaced at any time as long as you are capable of making your own decisions. It is recommended that you review your documents occasionally to ensure that they continue to accurately reflect your

You can download Advance Directive forms online or contact your local office on aging, your state health department or an attorney to learn more.

No one wants to envision a time when they are unable to make their own health care decisions. But, having your Advance Directives in place offers some assurance that there is someone you trust who will do thr best to honor your wishes.

#### City Reminds Residents to Perform Home Maintenance Checks

As the days get longer and we are all quarantined due to COVID-19, it provides an opportunity to address items around your home that may have been put off due to busy schedules. Here are some basic home maintenance tasks that would benefit the efficiency and appearance of your home:

- 1. Fertilize and mow the lawn
- 2. Trim up existing landscaping or plant something new
- 3. Wash down and arrange outdoor furniture
- 4. If needed, treat trees for illness and remove any dying branches
- 5. Survey your home's exterior for broken shingles, leaks and general wear of the roof and siding
- 6. Inspect and repair any cracks in the foundation
- 7. Power-wash grime from the exterior, including the driveway, porches, patios and siding
- 8. Touch up any chipped paint inside and outside (especially the trim on the exterior)
- 9. Check for leaks in pipes and outdoor faucets
- 10. Treat or restain your wooden porch or deck. Paint railings on the front porch






