It appears as if we may have an early Spring! Our Public Works Department is already planning the winter cleanup and making preparations for the active sports and recreation season. At a special event on May 1, 2015, the Township accepted a donation from the Educational Foundation and the ball field lights were turned on for the first time in our Recreation Park. The cost associated with these lights was made possible by donations received over a five-year period at various fundraisers to commemorate the life of Committeeman Michael Biron who passed away in 2008. Many thanks to the Biron family, the Fundraising Committee, the Educational Foundation, and all of those individuals who contributed to the success of this effort.

The Township Committee has introduced their 2016 Annual Budget, and a public hearing will be held on March 29, 2016 at the Township Municipal Building at 7:00 P.M. for anyone wishing to attend. If there are any questions relating to our budgeting process or the costs associated with township business, I am always available to discuss those matters with you. Please feel free to call me or to stop by the town hall. As always, many thanks to our elected officials and staff who work tirelessly to reduce costs wherever possible while maintaining the current services provided to our residents.

Last year on May 10<sup>th</sup> we suffered the loss of our beloved Deputy Mayor Daniel Coranoto. He was a dedicated public servant who was always willing to take on a challenge on behalf of the township and to lend a helping hand to anyone in need, inside or outside of his community. All of his contributions and tireless volunteerism would be impossible to include in this letter. In order to thank and commemorate Deputy Mayor Coranoto, the Township Committee is renaming the Community Center “The Daniel Coranoto Community and Senior Center.” He will forever be remembered by those of us who knew him and worked with him, and future generations will know that he deserved our respect and appreciation.

The Township is in the process of preparing bid specifications for a variety of Capital Improvements and other projects that will be constructed with the help of our Public Works Department. A walking path around the park is scheduled for construction this year with funds raised by the Recreation Committee. The Township intends to begin construction of the walking path in July, weather permitting.

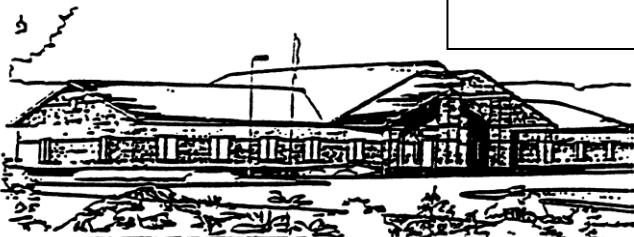

## DOG LICENSE RENEWALS

All dogs over seven months of age **MUST BE LICENSED**. In order for a license to be issued, the State of New Jersey requires that the animal is vaccinated against rabies. The rabies certificate must not expire prior to November 1st of the licensing year, if it does the animal will have to be revaccinated. If for some reason your vet doesn't want to revaccinate your dog prior to its expiration date, then please have your vet write a note stating why the pet cannot be vaccinated and then a license can be issued. Dog licenses may be obtained at the Hampton Township Municipal Building between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M., Monday through Friday or may be mailed to Hampton Township Municipal, 1 Rumsey Way, Newton, NJ 07860. They may also be placed in the brown lock box located next to the Municipal Office front doors, after hours. Any questions please call the Municipal Office at 973-383-5570. **Please provide proof of rabies vaccination, certification of spaying/neutering** (where applicable) and a fee of \$11.00 for a spayed/neutered dog and \$14.00 if the dog is not. If applying by mail please include a copy of a valid rabies certificate. **IMPORTANT NOTE:** A 2016 license will **not** be issued if the current rabies vaccination expires **BEFORE NOVEMBER 1, 2016**. A late fee of **\$5.00** is assessed for each delinquent month for each dog license issued after February 10<sup>th</sup> of the calendar year for which the license is required effective January 1, 2012.

The Hampton Township Free Rabies Clinic will be held on Saturday, November 5<sup>th</sup>, 2016 between 9:00 A.M. and 11:00 A.M. at the Hampton Township Public Works Building for both dogs and cats. At the present time cat licensing is not a requirement in Hampton Township. Stray cats are a major expense to the township & a nuisance to homeowners. Please do not feed or pick up a stray cat unless you are willing to take ownership of the animal as your pet & your responsibility.

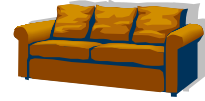

*Just as a reminder...*

**The current contract with Waste Management states that garbage can be picked up as early at 6 A.M. Please have your garbage out by at least 6 A.M. on garbage day in order to be assured your garbage will be picked up. Residents cannot expect a consistent timeframe for garbage and recycling pick up. If it's out by 6 A.M. it will be picked up.**

\*Bulk pick-up is for Hampton Township Residents **Only**. Do not allow other individuals to bring their bulk garbage to your residence. This is considered illegal dumping & is a punishable offense.

**Disposal Ban of Electronic Devices**

**Recycling Schedule is a weekly pick-up curbside every Wednesday throughout the entire Township.**

**NEWSPAPERS AND MAGAZINES WILL BE PICKED UP WITH RECYCLING ONLY**

Newspapers, Magazines, & other recyclables will be picked up once a week with Recycling. Do not put newspapers or magazines in paper or plastic bags. Recycling can be co-mingled and MUST be placed in containers that do not exceed 30 gallons.

**OTHER RECYCLABLE ITEMS INCLUDE:** Glass jars & bottles- all colors, Plastic Containers- #1-#7, Tin, Steel, & Aluminum Bakery & Beverage Containers, Mixed Fiber, Newspaper, Corrugated Cardboard & Brown Bags. Cardboard must be flattened & left out on **recycling** day. **\*\*Please rinse all containers**

**Department of Environmental Protection Urges Safe & Less Polluting Burning of Wood in Cold Weather**

The DEP is reminding NJ residents to take steps to reduce their impact on air quality when burning wood for heat as the weather turns colder, whether in fireplaces, wood stoves or outdoor wood boilers. The DEP recommends following these simple guidelines, including having a properly maintained woodstove or fireplace, to minimize your impact on the environment & your neighbors, while protecting your home & safety:

- Allow wood to season before burning it. Seasoning entails allowing the wood to sit outdoors for at least 6 months. Seasoned wood is darker, has cracks in the end grain & sounds hollow when smacked against another piece of wood.
- Use a wood moisture meter to test the moisture content of wood. Wood burns more efficiently when its moisture content is below 20%.
- Stack wood neatly off the ground with the top covered to protect it against rain & snow.
- Keep fires burning hot.
- Regularly remove ashes to ensure proper airflow.
- Never burn garbage, cardboard, plastics, wrapping materials, painted materials or other materials in your stove or fireplace.
- Keep anything flammable- including drapes, furniture, newspapers & books far away from any wood-burning appliance. Keep an accessible & recently inspected fire extinguisher nearby.

**KITTATINNY LITTLE LEAGUE**

A new era of Little League Baseball for the Kittatinny Regional School District began in the spring of 2015 when Kittatinny Little League (KLL) and Fredon - Stillwater Little League (FSLL) agreed to merge and operate as one league, known as Kittatinny Little League (KLL) serving the players, parents, and families of Hampton Township, Sandyston Township, Fredon Township, and Stillwater Township. KLL is a registered 501 (c)3 non-profit organization, supported and chartered through Little League International and New Jersey District 20.

For the 2015 spring season, just over 200 players ages 5-15 were registered and played with KLL. The Hampton Township Pit serves as the primary home for KLL, although fields in the other member towns are regularly used for practices and games. In July 2015, the KLL was honored to host the 2015 Northern New Jersey Section 1 Championship at the Hampton Pit. A tremendous week of baseball was played by some of the best 12-11 year old Little League players in Northern New Jersey in front of some great crowds at the Pit. So many local families and volunteers from KLL contributed significant amounts of time and effort to make sure KLL hosted a tremendous tournament. In August 2017, KLL and the Hampton Pit will be on display once again, this time serving as the host for Little League's New Jersey 12-11 Year Old State Championship with the winner advancing to the Mid-Atlantic Regional Championships in Bristol, CT.
