- Voice, Strings and Winds students will also receive general written comments about style, musicality, etc. In addition, one third of these students will be selected to perform in our Branch Winners Recital (which includes the Branch piano winners of the Bach Festival) to be held on Saturday, February 24 at 3:00 PM.

Memorization of music is *not* required. There is a 5-minute per student time limit.


