

Grace & Peace From the Pastor's Desk

Psalm 139:13-15

For it was you who formed my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb.
I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works;
that I know very well. My frame was not hidden from you, when I was being made in secret, intricately woven in the depths of the earth.
Ephesians 1:4 just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love.
1 Corinthians 6:17 But anyone united to the Lord becomes one spirit with him.

I'm sure you've heard the comment that you can't judge a book by its cover, but it has been proven that people do judge other people by first impressions. Do you know where the people get their information from? According to Leslie Zebrowitz, PhD, at Brandeis University people determine their first impression of you from your face.

Tests have shown that our brain reacts positively to certain faces. People find the most favorable traces of a face to be: having large eyes, short chins, round faces and large foreheads, in other words, having a babyface; how familiar a face looks to you; and, believe it or not, how healthy a person perceives your face to be will determine how they judge whether or not you are "likeable, intelligent, and capable" [Zebrowitz, L. A. (2017). First Impressions From Faces. Current Directions in Psychological Science, 26(3), 237–242. https://doi.org/10.1177/0963721416683996].

All our lives we will meet people who initially judge us on our outward looks, and for some of us we can find ourselves in a very difficult situation. Our face shape is determined at 4 weeks after conception, and we cannot control what our genes determine we will look like unless we go through plastic surgery.

Thank goodness that isn't how God judges us! The psalmist David tells us that God created us and that we were "fearfully and wonderfully made". Have you ever looked at a newborn baby? Isn't there a little bit of awe each time you see them? God made each of us to be exactly who we are.

If our appearance seems to be against us we can always remember that God created us in the image of God. When we become a follower of Christ we become one spirit with him. God sees us from the inside out. We don't have to worry that we will be misunderstood. When we become a follower of Jesus that is who God sees, a follower of Jesus, and he sees us with love.

So in the vast scope of things it makes no difference how the world perceives our outward appearance, God has us, God knows who we are on the inside, and that is what truly matters.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Thank you so very much for your financial donation to Holy Trinity ministries. The \$420.00 from your "Souper Bowl of Caring" donation has been placed into our Food Ministries Program Fund. The Pasta/Soup Kitchen reopened the first week of September and has been slowly building in attendance. Beginning the first week of February we added a Thursday lunch using the food stuffs that are gathered from the Country Fairs and Giant Eagle on Thursdays. So that we now provide a dinner on Tuesday and a lunch Wednesday, Thursday and Saturday, along with our free Clothes Closet on Tuesday and Saturday.

Currently we are serving people about 120 meals each week along with distributing approximately 20 food bags on Tuesday evenings. Holy Trinity members and the many volunteers from our ecumenical partners, offer loving hearts and helping hands, but only with the support of congregations such as Immanuel, through good wishes, prayers and financial support is it possible to fulfill God's mission with our neighbors in need.





BEING GREEN...Even When Dying

Green Corner NWPA Synod Green Team

CREATION-FRIENDLY END OF LIFE INTERMENT

There are currently two main methods for caring for the dead which use renewable natural resources, reduce our carbon footprint, and restore and preserve habitat.

GREEN BURIAL, often called NATURAL BURIAL involves no vaults or grave liners. The body is not embalmed. Containers used are made of natural or plantbased readily biodegradable materials. The body is buried at 3.5'-4' deep, with an 18" smell barrier. Natural burial is legal in most states, including PA, NY and OH. The nearest green burial certified funeral home is Burton Funeral Home in Erie (burtonfuneralhome.com) For further info, go to Greenburialcouncil.org

NATURAL ORGANIC REDUCTION (HUMAN COMPOSTING) is a relatively new burial alternative in which a person's remains are turned into usable soil. This involves placing the body in a special container and surrounded with natural materials like wood chips and alfalfa. Decomposition takes about a month, with the human remains broken down gradually into a nutrient-dense soil mixture, resulting in about a cubic yard compost. Non-organic matter like dental implants are sorted out, and then loved ones can take the entire result for use in a backyard garden or forest.

Human composting saves about 1.2 metric tons of carbon compared to traditional burial methods. The cost is usually more expensive than direct cremation but cheaper than traditional burial. It currently is legal in New York, Colorado, Vermont, California, Washington and Oregon, but additional states are considering it.
