E-SCOW HOME AND HOME RECAP

Strong winds greeted sailors coming in from Chautauqua Lake and Lake Hopatcong (New Jersey) on Friday and Saturday morning for the first leg of the E-Scow NYS Championship regatta at Keuka. This regatta commonly called the Home and Home, since there are 2 clubs, Keuka and Chautauqua, which host one leg each, had 14 Es registered to sail on June 15th & 16th.

Saturday morning the Es went out in a strong breeze that continued to build throughout the day. Three Es had issues that prevented them from finishing the first race. Only five Es completed the second race. Two masts came down and a third was saved by quick action of skipper and crew to use the spinnaker halyard to support the mast when the forestay gave way.
