#### Open to York, Sunbury, Queens, Kings and Saint John Counties

1. All grains must be the growth of this year or last year.
2. Exhibit must be correctly named as to variety and this name must appear on the entry tag.
3. Only one exhibit is allowed in any one class. (See Rules and Regulations).
4. All exhibits are to be in Fair Exhibit Building by 12:00 noon on Wednesday. Judging will start immediately and continue on Wednesday afternoon and evening. No persons will be allowed entry to Exhibit Hall Wednesday afternoon and evening unless they have valid reasons for being there.

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**CERTIFIED ORGANIC DISPLAY – FIELD CROPS AND HERBS**

Back by popular demand, a non-competitive display of certified organic field crops and herbs will be open to all certified producers in the province, providing an opportunity to showcase their organic products to the market. All categories of field crops and herbs will be accepted, as well as examples of value-added products. Growers must be registered with either of the two provincial certifying bodies, the Organic Crop Improvement Association (OCIA) or the Maritime Certified Organic Growers Co-op Limited (MCOG). Each exhibit should clearly identify the exhibit, as well as the grower’s name. Business cards and pamphlets describing the operation would be welcome. Back-drops may be used, but must not exceed 30 inches in height. Exhibitors must arrive with their displays at the Queens County Fairgrounds on the Wednesday of fair week before 9:00 p.m.

**NATURAL FOOD PRODUCTION DISPLAY – FIELD CROPS AND HERBS**

This non-competitive display will appeal to gardeners and agricultural producers alike who are interested in producing food using natural, environmentally-friendly techniques. Growers who have not taken the step to become certified-organic may use this opportunity to showcase their products, and share their knowledge and techniques. Each exhibit must be clearly described under the following headings:

- Crop Variety
- Growers name and location
- Measures used to encourage soil health and fertility (e.g. crop rotation and green manure crops).
- Measures used to encourage bio-diversity (e.g. mixed farming and crop rotation).
- Natural remedies found to be effective against pests, insects, etc.
- Measures used to maintain the genetic integrity of crops.

Business cards and pamphlets describing the operation would be welcome. Back-drops may be used, but must not exceed 30 inches in height. Exhibitors must arrive with their displays at the Queens County Fairgrounds by 12:00 p.m. on the Wednesday of fair week.
