And once again, this is why we cannot have nice things.... A member spent their time and money, making this table for general member use. Note I said Table and not target stand. There are 2 glowing errors in this picture on the right.

- 1. Someone used a table as a target stand.
- 2. Someone clearly shot something on the table.

Not a target, not a piece of steel, not a claybird in the berm, but an object, otherwise they would not have needed a table.. This behavior is unacceptable. it is extremely disrespectful to

the member(s) that built the table for your use. It is destruction of club property and a disregard for the prohibition on using "things", as targets. Things make dangerous shrapnel or ricochets. Do not shoot frangible things other than claybirds on any of our ranges. Both of these infractions are cause to answer to the board, with appropriate disciplinary action, including possible expulsion.



The target stands on the far left range are provided by volunteers and are not paid for by the club. They get destroyed, and that is understood by the volunteers that build them. If you don't like to use the destroyed stands, then bring your own. Do not use the gear tables as your target stand!

Remember, the ranges are under constant video surveillance. Had I caught this sooner, I would have reviewed the recording, and we would be having a different discussion. Rest assured, we will be more vigilant going forward.

3 Gun Congratulations to our First Place Winners in the **Vortex Optics York 3 Gun Point Series**

On October 6, the sixth match of the 2019 York Izaak Walton 3 Gun Point Series culminated in a head-to-head Vortex Optics Shoot Off. Sixty shooters competed in six matches over six months to accumulate points towards earning a coveted spot in the shoot off.

At the end of the series, the top 16 shooters along with the top seniors, ladies, and juniors were entered into the bracket and competed in a drag race to see who would end up in the finals. The drag race consisted of two mirrored stages where competitors shot rifles, shotguns and pistols. The first competitor to clear their stage and knock down the stop plate won the bout and advanced in the bracket. When the dust settled, Buddy Knight (2018 Shoot Off Champion) and Joe Pitha earned a spot in the finale. Joe was able to edge out Buddy and earn the title of 2019 Shoot Off Champion.

LAKE TONIAN

October has seen a change at the pond. The leaves are falling along with the water temperatures, but the fishing has begun to pick up. Largemouth bass are being caught on small suspending jerkbaits, small spinnerbaits, and small plastic baits. The term "small" is relative, as your typical "bass baits" seem to be too large for consistent catches.

Bluegill are being caught on small hairjigs suspended under a float and with micro (1.5") swimbaits. There has been a very consistent topwater feeding happening every evening about 45 minutes before dusk. An angler presenting dry flys during this period can be guaranteed constant action.

Reminder: please remove any bass smaller than 13" if caught. All panfish are to be returned, unharmed, back into the pond. We are seeing a documented improvement with the fish, both bass and panfish, since the new management program was put into effect in May.


