Baskets of Promise

"...satisfy the needs of the afflicted, then your light shall rise in the darkness and your gloom be like the noonday." Isaiah 58:10

When emergencies like natural disasters or conflict arise, many families must flee their homes, leaving their belongings behind. When they arrive in a refugee camp or other place of safety, they are scared, vulnerable and dirty from the travel. The simple items included in a Personal Care Kit allow them to wash away the dirt and sweat, with the fresh scent of soap and the softness of a towel as reminders of someone's care and concern for them in their plight.

Items may be brought to the church during the Lenten Season.

Each kit includes:

- One light-weight bath-size towel (20" X 40" to 52" X 27"), dark color recommended.
- Two or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars.
- One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging.
- One sturdy comb, (no picks or fine-toothed combs);
- One metal nail clippers (attached file optional)

A Brief Look At Some Summer Hill History By Harry Schwenk

This month we will take a look at some modern history, which occurred in the year 2004. The Rev. Frederick Fisher, our minister of 23 ½ years, decided to retire from the active ministry. Since he will be celebrating his birthday in March, I thought it would be fitting to devote my March article to him. Following is an article that we had in the newspaper about his retirement.

The Rev. Frederick I. Fisher, pastor of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Summer Hill, for the past 23 ½ years, retired from the active ministry on October 31st. A celebration of his ministry and retirement with a dinner and program was held on Saturday evening, October 30th at Pine View Acres in Pottsville. Three hundred twenty people, consisting of family and friends, attended the celebration. Among the friends in attendance were fellow pastors and parishioners from Summer Hill and some of Pastor Fisher's former parishes. The evening included a buffet dinner, musical entertainment, and several speakers honoring Pastor Fisher. Dave Schneck, a member of St. Paul's, the master of ceremonies, told Pastor Fisher's life history and added tidbits of interest. He also had a continuous slide show throughout the entire evening consisting of photos of Pastor Fisher, his family, friends, and scenes from church activities throughout the years.

Speakers who honored Pastor Fisher included Pastor Gene Handwerk, Pastor Joyce Seip, Pastor Bob Hoenich, Pastor Fisher's children, Andrew Fisher, Julie Schneider, and Amy Kovalski, and St. Paul's members, Judy Burcik, Earl Paxson, Kaye Schwenk and Dave Schneck. There were also several people in the crowd who offered memories and best wishes for the honored guest.

Throughout the evening, several songs were sung by "The King" (Pat Yarrish, Summer Hill's version of Elvis.) Musical numbers were also provided by the Summer Hill Girls Chorus, Bev and Ken Trumbo, Lindsey Schneck and Krista Feeser and St. Paul's Contemporary Worship Leaders.

Pastor Fisher is the son of Homer Fisher and the late Martha Fisher. He is married to the former Ardine Herring, and they resided in the Pine Grove area. They are the parents of three children: Andrew Fisher, husband of Michele; Julie, wife of The Rev. George Schneider; and Amy, wife of Edward Kovalski. They have two grandchildren, Andrew and Madison Fisher.

Pastor Fisher is a graduate of Pine Grove High School, Susquehanna University, and the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia. During his 38 years of active ministry, Pastor Fisher has served as pastor of the following Lutheran Churches: Ebenezer, New Tripoli; Salem-Hetzel's, Pine Grove area; St. Peter's, Pine Grove; Hope, Cherryville, and St. Paul's, Summer Hill.

During Pastor Fisher's ministry, he has officiated at well over 700 baptisms, 600 confirmations, 400 weddings, and 500 funerals.

Cultivating Generosity

Throughout the fall our congregations are often focused on stewardship and gratitude for the generosity of members. Folks provide stewardship talks, members complete commitment cards, and sermons are proclaimed to encourage generosity of time, talent and finances. But did you know that our ELCA Congregation and Synod Support Team offers training and recommendations on cultivating generosity?

This past fall, in partnership with the Lake Institute on Faith and Giving, stewardship leaders from eight congregations, representing four ELCA synods, came together for a training series called "Cultivating Generous Congregations" (CGC). Over seven weeks leaders from these eight congregations gathered online as a cohort with the Lake Institute's trained faculty and each other. Cultivating Generous Congregations maps the new landscape of religious giving and provides congregational teams with tools to build a culture of generosity unique to each congregation's needs, challenges, and opportunities. CGC explores theology, the role of adaptive leadership, fiscal transparency, and the importance of giver care, with action steps to impact the exploration of generosity and energize congregational generosity to take the significant and necessary steps to creating lasting cultural change.

Following the final session, the eight congregations received a year of access to the Lake Institute's numerous stewardship resources, as well as optional coaching to assist in the implementation of these practices. Mission Support funds the opportunity for congregations and leaders to learn from stewardship experts and one another and to grow together so that their local mission, and how God is growing generosity, can be told in more effective ways in today's culture.




