

Volunteer Examiners at "Mega Session" ham exam, UC Berkeley, February 22, 2019



Being a Volunteer Examiner, who is certified to grade and assist in amateur radio exam sessions, is another way we can give back to the ham radio community. VE's affiliated with ARRL and other VEC organizations are the first to welcome new hams, and to help and encourage

prospective hams at the exam sites.





CCCC members Ron, KE6RS; Randy, KA6BQF; Jeff, KJ6RHF; dj, KJ6DJ; Wing, KJ6YDE volunteered to assist Sharon, AA6XZ, who has been organizing these sessions, wrangling volunteers, supplies and parking permits for Michael (Miki) Lustig, KK6MRI's electrical engineering classes at UC Berkeley. The latest "VE Mega Session" took place at the Wozniak Lounge at Soda Hall on Friday, February 22, 2019 in midst of midterms.



At the end of the night, 85 student-candidates took 104 test elements in about 2½ hours (about 1¾ minutes per candidate)! With help from

additional luminary volunteers, including **ARRL East Bay Section Manager Jim Siemons, W6LK**, this edition of the UC Berkeley VE Mega Session yielded 72 Technician Class and 7 General Class licensees.

Member Highlight

Sharon Primbsch, AA6XZ



Q: How did you get started with amateur radio, and what have you done with it?

A: I became a ham in 1990 when my late husband (Henry, KK6PH) took the first of three field trips to Antarctica. He was an

electronics engineer who helped physicists at Space Sciences Lab UC Berkeley with observations of X-rays from the sun and super novae. This was done from unmanned highaltitude balloon gondolas about the size and weight of a small car. Each balloon was big enough to gift-wrap a football field. Other scientists, who were making simultaneous observations of the targets, needed to know when a balloon was launched. At the time, there was no reliable, quick communications available. Henry, two of his colleagues and I became licensed hams to help. I spoke with Henry using SSB from home for about 45 minutes daily. However, the grey-line propagation necessary to do that was not available at the time of the scheduled launch. So our "launch skeds" had to be done in CW (with very sweaty fists at both ends)!

I have participated in ARES/RACES in the past. Since I'm currently without an in-house electronics expert to help with my equipment, I'm typically not on the air. However, I participate in Field Day and help at the Marin Century bike ride every year. I've been the 3rd Vice President and Membership Chair of EBARC for several years. I'm also the editor of EBARC's newsletter, *The Blown Fuse*.

Q: Tell us more about your involvement with ARRL-VEC as a VE team leader.

A: As a ham, I especially enjoy helping other people get or upgrade their licenses. I became an ARRL Volunteer Examiner very early on. According to the ARRL's session counts, I have officiated at 169 VE sessions. Let's make that 170, because of the February 22's "Megasession," where sixteen VE's handled 85 candidates who took 104 tests in 2.5 hours!

My two smallest sessions were for one person each, one of which was for a blind person. I have probably led about 2/3 to 3/4 of those 170 test sessions. All these sessions are a big group effort by the participating VE's, who have shaped how they are conducted with their valuable feedback. I thank all of them!



Q: What do you like/love to do when you are not at your radio or conducting VE sessions?

A: When I'm not being a ham, I love to square dance – at least 3 times a week. I love to travel, and I belong to a 3D photography club, although I'm not very good at it yet. I love puzzles of all kinds. I also hope to get busier reading novels. However, I'll have to learn not to read so slowly – after all, novels aren't math books!

I try to keep up with everything scientific. I own an as-yet-unwatched DVD course in Organic Chemistry, a subject which is *very* different than when I earned my BS in Chemistry. When I retired, I thought I would continue writing software for fun. Maintaining apps, however, isn't very interesting!


