TRINITY OF GOD'S LOVE

(Exodus 34:4b-6, 8-9; 2Cor. 13:11-13; John 3:16-18)

This Sunday is the 12th Sunday in the Ordinary Time of the Church's Liturgical Calendar, but being the Sunday immediately following the feast of Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. After His resurrection, shortly before He ascended to heaven, Jesus met with His disciples and urged them: "I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. Go, therefore, and make disciples from all nations. Baptize them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit..."

Like other Revelations, the Most Holy Trinity is a Mystery, which is beyond human comprehension and understanding. Therefore, it cannot be subjected to pure natural reasoning. Every conscientious Catholic at some point of his or her Christian life, had to grapple with the sensibility of this Mystery. Many of the great Saints and Fathers of the Church have done a great deal to reflect on the mystery of the Trinity in an effort to teach it intelligibly and meaningfully to all of us. St. Patrick of Ireland used the Shamrock (three leaf clover) to explain the unity and the indivisible nature of the Triune God. The truth is that the Trinity is more than a dogma. It is about being loved by God and His desire to express Himself to us and to give us His love.

This is one of the feasts in the Church, which, as a doctrine, we look beyond the Scriptures in order to better understand the teaching behind this doctrine. Thus, the Catechism states: "The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in Himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the hierarchy of the truths of faith. The whole history of salvation is identical with the history of the way and the means by which the one true God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, reveals Himself to men and reconciles and unites with Himself those who turn away from sin." (CCC # 234)

The concept of God as a Triune God (Trinity) seems to have been first used by Theophilus of Antioch in 180 A.D. when he spoke of "the Trinity of God (the Father), His Word (Son) and His Wisdom (Spirit). It was not until the year 325 AD that the doctrine on the Most Holy Trinity was decreed at the Council of Nicea, and we profess it every time we recite the profession of faith. The doctrine of the Trinity teaches us that God is Three Persons in One Godhead. God revealed Himself to us as: "God the Father. God the Son and God the Holy Spirit." The doctrine of the Trinity, apart from teaching us to know about God, challenges us to know God. Two people who are in love always seek to know the one they love. They do not just want to know about them, but to know them. Even in this modern age when people meet their loved ones on the Internet, there is always the desire and interest to meet them face to face and to get to know them.

It is when you and I get to know the Father Who creates the universe, the Son Who redeems humanity, and the Holy Spirit Who sanctifies all, that we will come to appreciate the strength that exists in unity. The doctrine of the Most Holy Trinity teaches us about the unity that exists in the bond of the Father-Son-Holy Spirit. It challenges us to consider Who God is and thus, to respond to His love for us. "The grace of Christ Jesus the Lord, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all," especially all fathers of our parish on this Fathers' Day.
