Terri Moore is a professional artist whose work explores the complex relationship we have with the natural world. Drawing on shifts and changes in the environment, she focuses on the objects that provide perspective in their reaction to these changes. Her current work is centered around climate change and the Artic. Her iceberg

series visually speaks to the significant changes of the Arctic ice cap due to global warming and the changing weather patterns. Moore has exhibited nationally as well as internationally, is included in a variety of private and corporate collections and has a regular studio practice in the Hudson Valley, N.Y.

Terri Moore began her career at The Hotchkiss School in 2002. She teaches a full range of art classes and is passionate about the experience of learning.

Drawing on her experience of being an artist as well as an educator, Moore encourages her students to fully explore their ideas and engage in the process of asking a question and engaging in a sustained investigation.

"Artists are historians, inventors, problem solvers, and creators. Navigating something that moves you is about getting to the heart of the story, and that takes time and focus. To fully explore a subject matter is to understand it and start to have a conversation with it and about it. For me, this is process. The language for navigation is in the making."
