Important Trash Pick-Up Information

Despite notifying everyone multiple times of the new trash and recycle collection rules from Republic Services, a few households are still not following the proper guidelines.

Please review these below as it impacts the safety of their employees.

1. Put out the Republic Service containers only; no personal trash containers or bags.
2. If you have additional trash, use the recycle bin and put a note on it that states "trash" for the driver to pick it up.
3. Space your bins appropriately so the arm of the truck can pick them.

The drivers will skip houses not abiding by these directives.

Friendly Reminders

Please slow down while driving in the neighborhood. There are lots of people, children and pets in the streets.

The posted speed limit in the neighborhood is 25 MPH, and 15 MPH around corners.

Dog Walkers please pick up after your dogs.

There are plenty of bags around the parks, or you can bring your own.

Since we are all living with a lot of anxiety and uncertainty these days, please remember that everyone handles things differently, but everyone responds well to kindness.

This might be a good opportunity for all of us to help our neighbors in any way we can while always keeping a safe distance.
