

5th Sunday Ordinary Year C Lk 5:1-11

"Okay, if you say so, we will do it!" Aren't Peter and his fishing crew glad they listened to and followed Jesus' suggestion? And not just because they caught such a 'boatload' of fish, but because it revealed to them just who Jesus is: Their Lord. The apostles had been fidgeting with their nets in the boat all day as they sat and listened to Jesus teach and talk to the crowds. They were probably reflecting over their previous night's failure to catch a single fish! And through that quiet time, something in Jesus' words softened their hearts to realize that if they continue to rely only on their own tricks and skills, they will stay hungry. BUT, if they remain open to Jesus, and practice what He commands, then it will be like fish want to jump into their boat! Jesus will take care of them. They just have to stay with Him. Peter speaks for everyone in the boat (and still does in the Church through the role of our Pope), when he kneels before Jesus and professes his unworthiness to be in Jesus' company. Peter confesses his sinfulness, acknowledging that Jesus is Lord. Peter shows surprise that he can even be in Jesus' presence. But, Jesus ever welcoming and faithful invites not only Peter but those in his company to remain with Him as apostles. He assures them that if they put in with Him, then even greater things are coming. With Jesus, they have bigger fish to catch. In fact, they have people to catch! Playing on their job title, they are entering a line (of work) to catch and bring many, many people into God's kingdom (netting souls!) Jesus talks about these 'greater' actions ahead for them in John 1:50 when He tells Nathanael, "Do you believe because I told you that I saw you under the fig tree? You will see greater things than this" and in John 14:12 "I say to you, whoever believes in me will do the works that I do, and will do greater ones than these". So, when we stick with Jesus, things only get better-greater!

Maybe too much! I like to emphasize that sometimes, we feel like we are in over our head when it comes to following Jesus' call. Accepting some task from our Lord, we may feel like it is too large for us, and that Jesus overestimates our capabilities! But we have to remember who is calling: God. Would God start something He couldn't finish? Jesus tells parables celebrating a builder and king who wisely don't start campaigns/projects they can't finish in Luke 14:28-31.No, just as St Paul tells us in 2 Corinthians 3:5-6 "our qualification comes from God, who has indeed qualified us as ministers.." I imagine that after Peter follows the command of Jesus and catches SO MANY fish that the extreme weight endangers his precious equipment-Peter's nets our at the breaking point and both boats nearly capsize, he questions whether he is in over his head. But notice, even with this overwhelming task and result. Jesus brings them all (fishermen, the catch and boats) into shore safely. Yes, like the lyrics of the popular song of music group 'Of Monsters and Men' say, "This ship will carry our bodies safe to shore.." If the ship is Jesus', yes, we will always be brought safe to shore! But we have to be in Jesus' call! Sometimes we may feel that God has called us to perform a task in His service that is more than we can handle. We may even shrink from it feeling like we are not capable. But Jesus knows us (like did He did Nathanael, before ever speaking to him on earth before-John 1:50) and he knows our strengths and weaknesses. He shows awareness of our weaknesses when he says that He sends out His apostles as 'lambs among wolves' (Luke 10:3). So, Jesus will protect and He will provide. If I say, "I can't do it", Jesus responds "Show up with me and WE will do it!" Jesus will fill up what is lacking to complete the task, or provide the wisdom to realize that His will is/was not what I had in mind as 'completed job'. For example, if I am imagining that I am the one to carry the ball over the line, I may be mistaken. God only intends me to move the ball few more yards forward, as He has called someone else to complete the play-touchdown. So even the 'incomplete' from me is 'complete' for Him, as it sets up the next move to finish the game. Notice in today's gospel that Peter and His crew make the catch, but they have to call for God's other platers to come finish the job of drawing all the fish to shore. Luke 5:7 says "They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them." The entire call of God in this 'fish-catch' case here involved Peter handing off to the next group to bring the fish and men and boats all the way safely in to the shore! What I cannot accomplish, I still apply myself and trust God pulls all the other people into place for His will to be met! I show up and follow through and God's will be done, whether I see the whole plan or only a portion! Peace. Fr Brian
