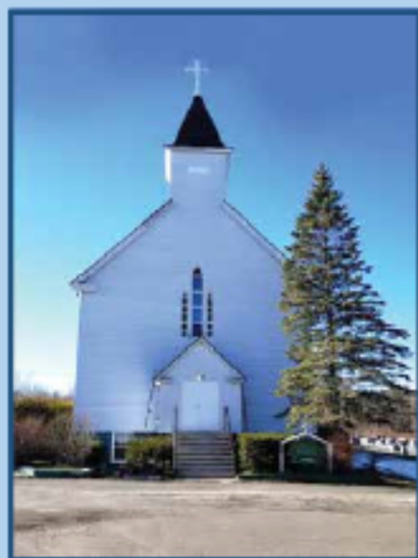
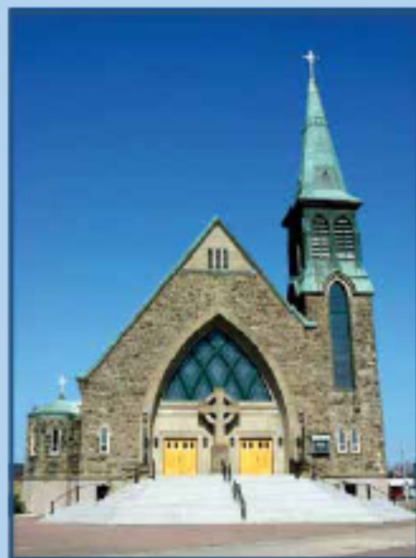

The children who have been preparing for their 1st Reconciliation this year, along with the children who prepared last year but were not able to celebrate due to Covid, will be celebrating the sacrament of Reconciliation on March 28th. We ask that you keep them in your prayers as they receive this healing sacrament.



**PALM SUNDAY:** Palms will be handed out as people enter the church by a volunteer who will be wearing gloves. There will be no procession and the palms will be blessed by the Presider at the start of the liturgy. We only have a limited amount of palms this year.

**HOLY THURSDAY:** The washing of the feet, traditionally celebrated, must be completely omitted this year due to Covid-19 protocols. St. Augustine's will remain open until 9:00pm for those who wish to adore the Blessed Sacrament, you must call the office at 857-4223 to **register** for adoration.

**GOOD FRIDAY:** Veneration of the cross will be a little different this year. We will proceed in the same manner as we do for Communion with the difference that **you cannot touch the cross**. You may bow, genuflect, or make other reverent gestures, but please refrain from touching.

**EASTER VIGIL:** There will be a fire this year but we will not be able to gather around it. People will be asked to go directly into the church where they will be handed a taper candle and seated.

**Laudato Si' – A Canadian Response** Last week's bulletin provided a link to the video *Laudato Si', A Canadian Response* to the encyclical letter written by Pope Francis in 2015 on the urgency of changing our care of God's earth. "This film revisits the 2015 Papal Encyclical *Laudato Si'* with an update on the global climate crisis as well as an exploration of the impact of the loss of biodiversity and the emergence of COVID-19. Following the three-step: Seeing, Judging, Acting methodology from Catholic Social Teaching, the film explores the issues of Water, Global Warming and Loss of Biodiversity with Fr. Joshtrom Kureethadam, a cosmologist in Rome, Leonardo Boff, well known Liberation Theologian in Brazil and Canadian activists like Maude Barlow and Catherine Abreu. The film is designed as an educational primer for parishes, high school and university programs concerned with the Global Climate Crisis."

**Amoris Laetitia** On March 19, 2021, the Church celebrated five years since the publication of the Apostolic Exhortation *Amoris Laetitia* on the beauty and joy of love in the family. On that day, Pope Francis launched the Year "*Amoris Laetitia* Family," which will continue until June 26, 2022, where it will be concluded at the 10<sup>th</sup> World Meeting of Families in Rome. This special year will highlight the importance of the family within the domestic Church and will promote the importance of community ties among families through various spiritual, pastoral, and cultural proposals. Stay tuned as we determine how that will be lived in our archdiocese. We will also provide links to videos prepared by Pope Francis, as they become available. In her book of essays, *Wouldn't Take Nothing for My Journey Now*, author and poet Maya Angelou wrote "I'm always amazed when people walk up to me and say, 'I'm a Christian.' I think, 'Already? You already got it?' I'm working at it..."

Possibly the most important conversion experience I have encountered personally involved coming to the realization that becoming Christian is a life-long process and while I may experience times of growth, I will never fully "have it." I might backslide at times. There will be no "One Night Only" event when I suddenly see God, Jesus and the world with divine clarity. Never will there be a time when I possess all the answers for everyone, and never will there be a time when I am not in need of God's love. Being fully initiated into the Catholic Church is only the beginning and striving to be Christian involves an almost continual evolution because in my experience, just when I think I've "gotten it" I am once again challenged to grow.

The butterfly is a popular Christian symbol because the transformation to butterfly from caterpillar represents resurrection, new life, and conversion. Imagine you are a caterpillar inching along munching leaves until one day a process beyond your control forces you to stop what you're doing. You work hard to spin your shelter until you are cocooned in darkness, where you will stay for a length of time you have no control over. Everything you know from your caterpillar world has vanished and there are forces at work you do not understand, and then one day you emerge stunningly transformed.

The COVID-19 pandemic of 2020-2021 has been destabilizing to many of us. Our sense of normality evaporated before our eyes to be replaced by a series of regulations and restrictions most of us have not experienced in our lifetime. Elements of daily life once taken for granted have been stolen from us indefinitely and even though a vaccination strategy provides us with desperately needed hope for emerging from this pandemic, we cannot yet fully know how we will have been changed by it. Pope Francis has frequently called for the faithful to use the COVID-19 pandemic as a chance to "re-imagine a global economy that values people and the planets over profits, and one where (fellowship) and solidarity guide human relationships rather than conflict and division." (Associated Press, 2021) So, Francis has encouraged us to take the opportunity at a global level to rebuild a better planet, but how does this apply to me personally?



I am certain that even amid the hibernation, darkness, fear, isolation, news headlines, and global death count of 2.7 million, the Holy Spirit has presented me with opportunities for transformation...to shed what I have outgrown and to see the world through a fresh lens. If I can do this, then the goodness planted by God in my heart can grow, bloom, and change me.

In today's gospel, Jesus reminds us that for new growth to occur in our hearts and minds, we must die to ourselves: our desires, our selfishness, and our old patterns. It is not good we have been forced to take up combat with a virus for which we were unprepared, but goodness can emerge from difficult challenges, even spiritual transformation. There is an opportunity to reboot and to reconsider what brings me life and what does not bring me life. In retrospect, what elements of my pre-pandemic existence did not contribute to my flourishing? What might I have been wrong about? Did I really know everything? What mistakes might I have made? What have I been holding on to that drains me of energy? Who was I before the world got its hands on me? What transformation will I permit?

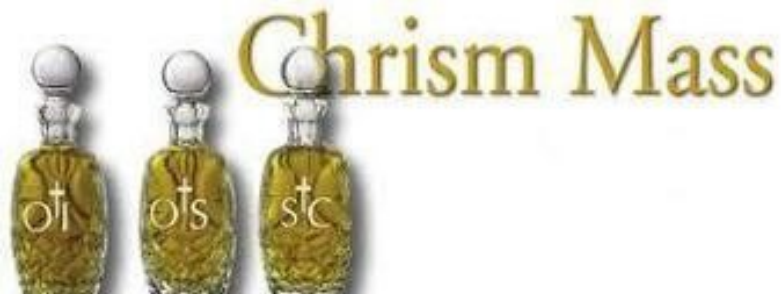

### *Invitation to the Chrism Mass*

With great joy, I will preside at the Chrism Mass on Wednesday, March 31, 2021, at 10:00 a.m. at the Cathedral. The celebration will be less elaborate than in past years because of the restrictions imposed by COVID-19, but we will maintain all the essential parts. The Chrism Mass is a manifestation of unity with the diocesan bishop. The renewal of priestly promises, the consecration of the Holy Chrism, and the blessing of the oils for the sick and catechumens are essential elements of the celebration.


By following the directives of the public health (the wearing of masks and a distancing of 2 meters), we expect to accommodate about 225 people in the Cathedral. We ask those interested in participating to register on March 22, 23, and 24 from 10:00 to 12:00 and from 1:00 to 3:00 by calling 506-857-9531 ext. 1240. Volunteers will take the necessary information, including the number of people included in your family bubble, to establish the list of participants according to the NB Public Health norms.
