The sons of Ephraim were archers equipped with bows, yet they turned back in the day of battle. They did not keep the covenant of God and refused to walk in His law; they forgot His deeds and His miracles that He had shown them. Carnal weapons do not win the war against Satan, or his doctrines. It's a matter of principle, i.e., having authority for every religious practice. Carnal resources do not add to one's faith (2) Peter 1:5-9); renewing of the mind does (Rom. 12:1-2) Carnal weapons are of no use when faith is tested (James 1) The "day of battle" is about taking a stand for God's truth, resisting or giving in to temptation. When the battle is "set in array", what will determine the outcome? David was properly armed to defeat Goliath when the battle was "set in array" (1 Sam. 17). What "weapons" decided the outcome...stones, or his faith in God? Carnal weapons, or purpose of heart to (Cont. Pg. 4)

- A. Common Question:
 - 1. Acts 16:30 What must I do?
 - 2. Matt. 19:16 What good thing shall I do?
 - 3. Lk. 3:12 Publicans: What must we do?
 - 4. Lk. 3:14 Soldiers: What must we do?
 - 5. Jn. 6:22-28 Multitude: What must we do?
- B. Isa. 33:13-16 Who will dwell on high?

I. He Who Walks Righteously:

- A. Walk = he who walks in all the relations of life in the full measure of righteousness, i.e., who practices it continually. (Keil & D).
- B. Righteously righteous acts, ethically right, truthfulness, etc. (Strong's)
- C. Righteousness is a standard:
 - 1. Rom. 10:1-3, 5 ignorant of God's righteousness
 - 2. 1 Jn. 3:7, 10 "he that doeth righteousness is righteous"
- D. Gen. 18:19 No man can say he is righteous who has not first been taught.
- E. Exod. 18:20 "wherein they must walk"
- F. Isa. 33:15-16 This is the man of whom Isaiah said, "shall dwell on high."

II. He Who Speaks Uprightly:

- A. Speak "whose words are in perfect agreement with his inward feelings and outward condition" (K&D)
- B. Uprightly: evenness, uprightness, straightness, equity (Strong's)

- C. 2 Tim. 2:15 Timothy told to "handle aright the word of truth," i.e., "cut it straight."
- D. Prov. 12:18 "the tongue of the wise is health."
- E. Prov. 18:21 "Death and life are in the power of the tongue..."
- F. Therefore, the Lord warns against the use thereof:
 - 1. Prov. 10:19 "In the multitude of words there wanteth not transgression."
 - 2. Jam. 3:1-12 Dangers thereof
- G. Eph. 4:29 "good for edifying"
- H. Isa. 33:15-16 This is the man of whom Isaiah said, "shall dwell on high."

III. He Who Despises the Gain of Oppression:

- A. Despises rejects, or refuses (Strong's)
- B. Gain plunder (ibid).
- C. Oppression extortionate deed, extortion
- D. He does not seek gain at the expense of those who would be injured thereby:
 - 1. Extortion "ravening, pillage" ravening (of a ferocious wild animal) extremely hungry and hunting for prey
 - 2. Lk. 11:39-41 "full of extortion"
 - 3. Lk. 20:45-47 "who devour widow's houses"
 - 4. Job 29:12 "I delivered the poor"
- E. Isa. 33:15-16 This is the man of whom Isaiah said, "shall dwell on high."
