The road crew did a great job getting the homes down quickly. Mother nature is not cooperating with us so we can finish with the fill dirt and seeding the lots but as soon as the weather breaks we will be back at it. The crew with Elite Excavating has been a huge help to us while we were in the area. They are currently working on the sanitary sewage in mon-e-bak and were able to help us tremendously.

With the help of the Central Ohio Community Improvement Corporation the township is in the process of taking ownership of 1248 Tedco Dr., 462 Hart Rd., 1439 Little Ave., 462 Prospect and 1820 Eastfield Dr. N. After the township has ownership of the properties they will be demolished or sold as is. More information to come concerns those parcels in the near future. Our plan is to continue to work diligently on the blighted homes in the township.

Police Department News

In Feb 2015 due to the decline of state monies and the police levy bringing in an average of 10% less each year the board of trustees voted to lay off 4 full time police officers. This left staffing of (6) full time officers including the chief. It was determined that with a staffing level that low it was only possible to staff (1) shift safely. The Franklin County sheriff's office handled **ONLY high priority** calls when our officers were off. All other calls for service were referred to the township when an officer was available.

In Feb 2016 after negotiating an agreement with the FOP, we were able to hire (6) part time officers. These officers worked approximately 1 to 2 (8) hour shifts per week. This enabled us to begin working (2) shifts; 8am to 4pm and 4pm to midnight. The length of this agreement will expire July 1, 2018 with the understanding that we would put on a levy and return to a minimum of (11) full time officers.

The township will be placing a 5 year temporary police levy on the ballot this May 2, 2017. An open informational meeting will be held at Central Baptist Church on Thurs April 13 at 6PM. The church is located at 1955 Frank Rd, Columbus OH 43223. Township and police administration will be on hand to answer any questions that you may have. The police department is currently working with and assisting several block watches in the township. The current block watches are the Ongaro area, mone-bak area, Broadlawn area, and Eastfield Dr. area.

Road Department News

Road Safety: We are coming into the warm weather months when there will be projects going on along the roadway, please take it upon yourself to give the road workers enough clear distance and abide by the warning signs to make our "work zones" a safe place to work.

License Taxes: A portion of your license taxes goes to Franklin Township, which is used for roadwork. Please make sure that your license agency has your license plates entered into taxing district #2568. Otherwise, your license taxes go to another entity.

House Bill 50 – Grass cutting: As we move into grass cutting season it is important to remind residents that you are required to maintain your properties to 8" or less in height. Failure to maintain your property forces the Township to get involved. Not only does it drag down the property values and attracts mosquitoes, mice, and other animals, it ends up being costly to the owner with the costs associated with the clean-up that become liens on the property tax duplicate.

STORM WATER RUNOFF AND POLLUTION MANAGEMENT

With the Warm Weather and Summer months upon us we all need to make sure that we are doing our part to prevent Storm Water Runoff Pollution from entering our Waterways. A rule to always remember is that all of our Storm Drains eventually end up in a local Waterway (Creek or River). These pollutants harm the Wildlife and also pose a threat to our Drinking Water. We all contribute to water pollution and we can reduce this pollution by practicing good stewardship at home. There are many ways that Residents of Franklin Township can do their part to reduce these harmful pollutants, here are a few examples:

- 1 If you have a household sewage treatment system (Septic System or Aerator) make sure this it is functioning properly.
- 2 If you fertilize your lawn, read the Labels and do your research to ensure proper application and timing. Sweep up any Fertilizer from Sidewalks, Driveways and other hard surfaces so that it doesn't wash into a Storm Drain.
- 3 Keep lawn and yard waste (raked leaves, yard clippings, etc.) out of the street and backyard streams. Remember, Storm Drains discharge directly into our Streams and Creeks.
- 4 Pick up Pet Waste and dispose of it properly.
- 5 Wash your car in an area where the wash and rinse drains to a grassy area and not into the street, or wash it at a commercial car wash.
- 6 Install practices that infiltrate rain water into the ground such as Rain Barrels and cisterns that store water that can be reused. Directions for building Rain Barrels can be picked up at our Township Office.

Fire Department News

I would love to say "Welcome to Spring", but it's Ohio and we all know that when you don't get Winter in Winter, you get Winter in Spring. Let's all hope that Spring arrives sooner than later!

With a change in the clocks, please remember to replace your smoke detector batteries. They should be changed twice a year; when we "fall back" and "spring forward" for daylight savings time.

Over the past two years, your fire department has given out and installed over 300 smoke detectors to the residents of Franklin Township. However, we want to make sure that EVERY residence in Franklin Township has working smoke detectors. Franklin Fire has officially partnered with the Red Cross of Ohio to start a "Smoke Detector Initiative" throughout the Township. The Initiative officially kicks off on April 1st, 2017 and is a "no cost" to our residents. Your firefighters will be joined by the Red Cross in going door-todoor throughout areas of the Township to install smoke detectors. We will be visiting the Ongaro and North Hague Ave neighborhoods on April 1st. After that, our firefighters will go out once a month to a different neighborhood to install smoke detectors. Our goal is to knock on every door of the Township and make sure a working smoke detector is available. If you would like a smoke detector, and we haven't knocked on your door yet, please call Captain Todd Broecker at (614) 279-9411 ext. 2309 to schedule a time for the firefighters to install a smoke detector in your home. We have seen a decrease in fire related deaths and injuries over the past few years, and we hope to continue that trend.

Once again, we want to thank you for your support of the hardworking members of Franklin Township Fire Department. Without you, we wouldn't be here, and we do not take that responsibility lightly. I hope that you will continue to support your safety services; a strong fire and police department helps keep a safe and strong Franklin Township. Stay safe and have a great Spring.
