E. Remote Snow Days

The State Education Department authorized a “snow day pilot” program during the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 school years. This program allowed school districts to deliver instruction remotely on days in which it would otherwise have closed due to an emergency. It is anticipated that this will be adopted permanently at the Regents July meeting.

G. Local CTA Dues

As per our constitution and By-Laws, I may recommend that the Executive Board approve a local membership fee increase. After a thorough review of our finances by our treasurer Jim Fiola, I believe this will not be necessary for next year. As a result, our local dues shall remain the same for next year.

H. Union Sick Bank

Thank you very much to all who have donated so far. Many of our members have been using the targeted day option on the donation form. Please remember you still have the option to donate directly to the bank. As the school year comes to an end, I hope each of you sees fit to donate at least one day to the bank to ensure the continuation of this valuable benefit. If you know of anyone that is leaving the district and has day(s) in their bank, please ask them to donate.

I. Sell-back of Health Insurance

If you have elected to “sell-back” your health insurance, you should have received your second half payment as separate paycheck on June 13. Please keep in mind that if you sell-back your health insurance you are still entitled to our Dental and Eyeglass plans.

J. Annual Turn-In of Sick Days

If you have accumulated at least 75 sick days and wish to exercise your option of selling back unused sick days earned this year (up to 12 or 14 if you worked at Summer School) you must submit a “[Request for Payment in Exchange for Accumulated Unused Sick Days](#)” form to Dr. Natali’s office. The rate is \$98.05 per day. Please be aware that you can accumulate up to 200 days in your sick day bank. Any days in excess of 200 should be sold back to the district or donated to the Sick Bank.

K. Study Money Dates

Those who were approved for the May 13th summer study money were listed on the May 24, BOE agenda. Looking ahead to next year, the tuition reimbursement dates will be Fall-9/30/22, Winter-12/9/22, and Summer-5/12/23. The application is available online at [Request for Participation in Study Program— Group A](#).

L. Pay Options

Each year you have three pay options:

- 21 equal bi-weekly payments (September through June)
- 25 payments; 21 payments (September through June) + 4 payments on the last day of school
- 26 payments; you will receive 1/26 of your annual salary every two weeks from the first pay date in September through the last pay date in June when you will receive the remaining paychecks as separate checks, all dated June 30, which you may deposit at any time from June to August. Direct deposit will not be available for the last six paychecks. All deductions will be spread out over the 26 pay checks.

To elect an option other than the one you currently have; you must enroll prior to June 30 and the new option may not be changed until the start of the following school year. Click here for the [form](#).

M. Eyeglass Reimbursement-- *Reminder*

We are in year two of a two-year cycle for eyeglass/contact purchases. Members have \$400 to spend on glasses/contacts. Plus, such coverage may now be used for the member and their family. Completed claim [forms](#) with receipts attached must be sent to the HR department in Administration, or email Dr. Natali.

N. Packing and Unpacking

Teachers who are moving and/or packing due to an alternative use of their room or a room transfer shall be paid \$26.17 per hour up to a maximum of 4 hours. The work must be done outside of the school day and a record kept of the dates and times.

O. Health Care Bonuses-- *Reminder*

The recently adopted 2023 state budget created a healthcare and mental hygiene workers bonus program to recruit and retain existing employees. The association is continuing to discuss this process with the district for our eligible members. At this time, we are waiting to see if the Commissioner of Health will develop forms, and procedures that may be needed. I look forward to bringing you more information throughout the process.

C. Union dues for 2021/2022 for full-time members will remain at \$1,017.96.
