Regular Monthly Meeting

Salute to the Flag: Regular meeting call to order:

Chairman- Jaime Hartline, Vice-Chairman Raymond Guzic, Jr., and Solicitor Thomas Swope.

Supervisor- Scott Guzic was unable to attend.

Public Participation:

As Discussed:

<u>John Hurley</u>- Representing the Lilly Washington War Memorial- reported to the Supervisors on the Insurance Premiums for the LWWM and the Vicinity Lilly Area Baseball Association, split cost between Washington Township and Lilly Borough,

Current premiums as follows: General Liability-\$1,036.36- Property/ Inland Marine \$1,589.00-Accident Policy \$2,552.42 totaling \$5,177.78- Washington Township's share is \$2,588.89.

Motion made by Raymond Guzic, Jr. 2nd Jaime Hartline to accept the insurance premium through Ebensburg Insurance and to agree to split the insurance cost for the Lilly Washington War Memorial with Lilly Borough. All in favor, Motion passed.

Neal Hammond and David Fulton/Keystone Fire and Rescue Department- presented a report to the Township Supervisors: Outlining the 2022 Service Agreement between Washington Township and the Keystone Fire and Rescue Department- Solicitor to review, ISO review to be completed in 2022, the grant received from the 1889 Foundation, repairs that need to be completed to the various fire department buildings, training on rescue techniques. And to ensure that the Lilly-Washington Volunteer Fire Department operating under the Keystone Fire and Rescue Depart will stay operational in Lilly and a Thank You for all the Supervisors help in the annual carnival fundraising event.

<u>Savana Koval</u>- updated presentation of her Girl Scout project, with concerns of the Spotted Lantern Fly, her homemade trap used to catch the lantern fly in the nymph stage, and permission to place the trap in the Paul A. Cooney Recreation and Sports Complex. Also four trees are to be planted around the proposed gazebo, asking the township for help in planting four trees in conjunction with the gazebo. Gazebo is to be delivered within 6-8 weeks. The township is more than willing to help

Savana with the tree planting and gazebo placement.

<u>Donald Franey</u>- Presented to the Supervisors and draft subdivision for property located along Plane Bank Road, to be completed and presented to the township at a further date for approval.

<u>Mark Yagoda</u>-Concerns of the Ordinance 2021-1- Dual Use Roads along Memorial Drive. <u>Ronald Yagoda</u>- Against the Ordinance 2021-1- Dual Use Roads along Memorial Drive- Requested quiet zone signs from the Allegheny Ridge Recreation Association.

Roy Hanlon- Against the Ordinance 2021-1- Dual Use Roads, requested quiet zone signs from the Allegheny Ridge Recreation Association.

<u>Tony Zummer</u>- Against the Ordinance 2021-1- Dual Use Roads along Memorial Drive. <u>Charles Nicholson</u>- Against the Ordinance 2021-1- Dual Use Roads along Memorial Drive. <u>JoAnne and Ronald Courtot</u>- Against the Ordinance 2021-1- Dual Use Roads along Memorial Drive.

Beverly Mandichak- Against the Ordinance 2021-1- Dual Use Roads along Mountain Road. David Myers-Concerns of Ordinance 2021-1 along Hilltop Road.

Joe Giblock- Concerns of Ordinance 2021-1.

All residents had issues with liability, safety, noise and dirt pollution, deterioration of township roads, paved or unpaved, from the ATV use along dual use township roads. The many encounters between ATV's riders and property owners who wish the ATV's would respect their private personal properties. Also voiced concerns with how the Ordinance will be policed and riders monitored along dual use roads.

<u>Doug Wagner and Jason Olbert</u>-representing the Allegheny Ridge Recreation Association commented on the Ordinance 2012-1-Dual Use Roads, from experience dealing with ATV riders, they believe the ordinance would cut down on speeding and riders would be respectable. PA Vehicle Code needs to be adhered to. Some property owners allow ATV riders on their property. ARRA is currently working on trail from the 911 Memorial Center to various municipalities.

Ordinance 2021-1 states any person driving and/or operating any snowmobile or ATV shall do so in a safe manner as defined in 75 Pa. C.S.A. 7726. Also states that the Ordinance can be repealed at any time at the discretion of the Township Supervisors. Residents of Washington Township have requested from the Supervisors access to dual use roads.

Solicitor's Report:

- ➤ Ordinance 2021-1-designating township roads T-415-Mountain Road, T-455-Hilltop Road, T-417- Memorial Drive, T-454 Park Road as snowmobile roads and all-terrain vehicle roads, open to vehicular, snowmobile and all-terrain vehicle traffic.
- ➤ Supervisors believe this ordinance needs to be given a chance, with the addition to the walking trails at the Sports and Recreation Complex; ATV accesses to riding areas were taken away.
