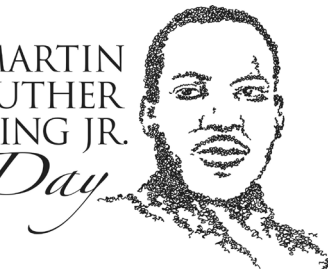

Register O'Donnell Warns Homeowners About Deed Scam

Continuing his efforts to combat consumer fraud, Norfolk County Register of Deeds William P. O'Donnell is once again advising county residents to disregard a direct-mail solicitation offering them a certified copy of their property deed for an outrageous fee of anywhere from \$59.50-\$86.00.

Register O'Donnell stated, "There is a California company that continues to send direct-mail solicitations to unsuspecting homeowners asking them to send a check for \$86.00 in order to receive a copy of their deed. If a consumer knew that the Registry of Deeds would provide them the same certified copy of a property deed for a charge of only \$1.00 per page, plus an additional \$1.00 for postage, they would never agree to pay such an outrageous fee for service. The average price for a mailed homeowner's deed by the Registry (usually two pages) is \$3.00."

"These solicitations," noted O'Donnell, "are labeled Recorded Deed Notice and request that the homeowner forward a check in the amount of \$86.00 for a copy of their deed. The Registry has been contacted by many who have received this solicitation. Do not fall for this scam."

Register O'Donnell concluded, "While the deed direct-mail solicitation may be legal, it's certainly not ethical. In my judgment, this is a scam being perpetrated against hard working Norfolk County residents, many of whom are first-time

homeowners or elderly. Consumers are interpreting these notices as a bill, since they are affixed with a due date. I again urge in the strongest terms that Norfolk County citizens not let themselves fall prey to these types of misleading deed scam advertisements."

Additionally, if you desire a copy of your own deed, also contact the Registry's Customer Service Center and we will be glad to provide you with one for a nominal fee of usually \$2.00-\$3.00.

Happy New Year!

Dear Houghs Neck Residents,

I hope you all had wonderful holidays and are enjoying a happy new year! The 191st session of the General Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts began on January 2nd at 11am. The 160 members of the House of Representatives and the 40 members of the State Senate were sworn into office by Governor Charlie Baker. This session represents one of the most diverse in history in terms of both race and gender. The 2019 House freshman class is composed of 25 members, the largest since my class of 39 in 2011. The Governor and Lieutenant Governor were sworn in for a second 4-year term on January 3rd and other constitutional officers will be sworn in to office on January 16th.

At the start of the session, prior to the election of a Speaker of the House and Senate President, the longest serving member of each respective body presides over the session. Immediately after the swearing-in of the new Legislature, there was the election of the Speaker of the House, the House Minority Leader, Senate President and Senate Minority Leader. Robert DeLeo (D-Winthrop) was elected to his 6th term as Speaker of the House. Bradley Jones (R-North Reading) was elected to his 9th term as House Minority Leader. Karen Spilka (D-Ashland) was elected to her first full term as Senate President and Bruce Tarr (R-Gloucester) was elected to his 5th term as Senate Minority Leader.

The House of Representatives is now composed of 127 Democrats, 32 Republicans, and 1 non-party affiliated member. The Senate has 34 Democrats and 6 Republicans.

The Democratic Party continues to hold a supermajority with the ability to override a Governor's veto with a two-thirds vote.

At the start of session, no legislator has any committee assignments. Each representative meets with the Speaker of the House and advocates for their specific committee assignments. This is the same in the State Senate. The members of the majority party will hold chairmanships, while the minority party will appoint ranking minority members. The recommendations by the Speaker and Minority Leader for committee assignments are then voted on by their corresponding Democratic and Republican caucuses. In mid-January, the House and Senate will debate and vote on rules of operation of the House, the Senate and the Joint Committees. The rules also establish what the committees are for the session. In 2017-2018, there were 28 Joint Committees, where both a House and Senate member co-chair the committee. There are 13 House members and 7 Senators on a Joint Committee. The House and Senate each also have 11 standing committees. Standing committees are committees which are not co-chaired between the branches; the membership size varies depending on the committee.

Finally, thank you to the voters of the 2nd Norfolk District for allowing me to serve you for a 5th term. I look forward to continuing to work hard on your behalf in the 191st legislative session!

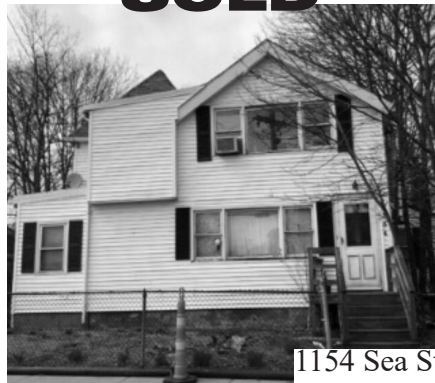

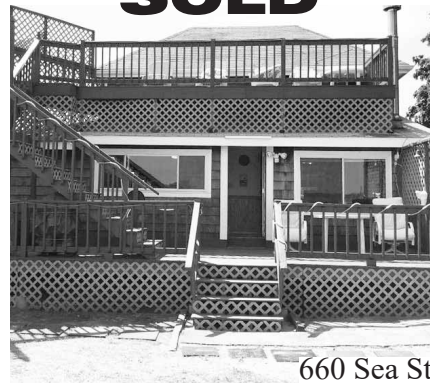

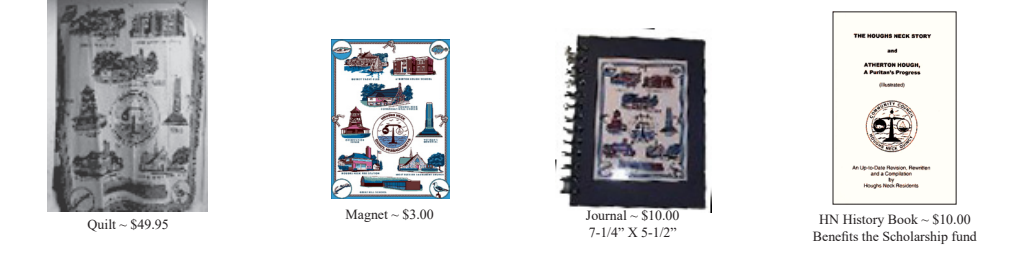
