Heart Ache!

TREASURER'S REPORT

The financial situation of the Association is firm. We began the year with \$4,368.43 and ended the year with \$6,283.85. We received receipts of \$18,572 for the year and made payments of \$16,656.58. Included in the receipts is \$900 for Life Membership and \$150 for annual dues. The sale of hats and shirts added an additional \$2,153 and donations of \$45 were made. An additional \$125 was collected at the reunion and donated to The Education Center at the Vietnam Wall.

We purchased Hats, Shirts, Sweatshirts and Crests during the year and sold \$2,453 worth during the year as well as at the reunion. Additionally, we sold photos, bumper sticker and videos at the Reunion for an additional \$128.

The Reunion in our Nation's Capital was a huge success with over 175 attendees that included members of VVAQ 140 and 267. We had a wonderful time touring Washington DC, the monuments and the Marine Museum. We also had many of us read names at the Wall during "The Reading of the Names" as well as participating and laying a wreath at the Wall during the 30th Anniversary of the Wall Proceedings. Between registration and some donations, the Reunion receipts were \$14,861. Expenditures for lunches, dinners, and pizza as well as the cost of the tour and hospitality room expenses amounted to \$13,452.32. Additionally, \$265 registration fees were returned and \$50 went to Mark Arguello for the videos.

We are in great financial shape and look forward to the preparation of the 2013 Reunion in Tucson, AZ in September-October.
