A RESOLUTION

Adopting a tentative tax budget commencing January 1, 2021 pursuant to Section 5705.28(A)(2) of the Ohio Revised Code, and declaring an emergency to exist.

WHEREAS, Section 5705.28(A)(2) of the Ohio Revised Code mandates that the legislative authority of the City of Fostoria, Ohio adopt a tax budget for the next succeeding fiscal year on or before the fifteenth day of July; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Finance and Ohio State Auditor present to the Council a tentative tax budget commencing January 1, 2021, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as though fully re-written herein; and,

WHEREAS, the Council of the City hereby finds said tentative tax budget to be well-taken and desires to timely adopt the same.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Fostoria, Seneca, Hancock, and Wood Counties, Ohio:

SECTION 1. The Council of the City of Fostoria, Ohio hereby approves and adopts the City's tentative tax budget commencing January 1, 2021, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as though fully re-written herein.

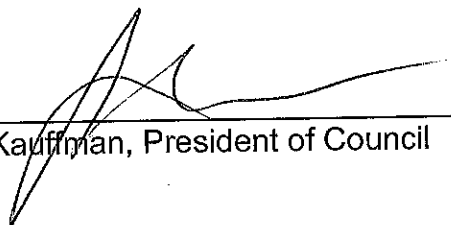
SECTION 2. The Clerk of Council is hereby directed to certify a copy of this resolution to the Seneca County Auditor on or before July 15, 2020.

SECTION 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, and in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 4. This resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of public health, safety and welfare. The reason for such emergency is the fact that the Seneca County Auditor must receive this resolution by July 15, 2020.

THEREFORE, upon the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all members elected to Council, and signature by the Mayor, this resolution shall go into immediate force and effect.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend Ordinance 2015-24, and declaring an emergency to exist.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City approved ordinance 2010-58 submitting a ballot measure to levy a temporary one per-cent (1%) income tax levy to the electorate in the general election held on November 2, 2010; and,

WHEREAS, in the general election held on November 2, 2010, a majority of electors who cast ballots approved a one per-cent (1%) income tax levy to be assessed on various net income, commencing on January 1, 2011 and discontinuing on December 31, 2016, to supplement a permanent one per-cent (1%) income tax levy established by ordinance B-664; and,

WHEREAS, ordinance 2010-58 included a "sunset" provision that gave effect to the levy until December 31, 2016; and,

WHEREAS, in the general election held on November 3, 2015, a majority of electors who cast ballots approved a continuation of the one per-cent (1%) income tax levy to be assessed on various net income, commencing on January 1, 2017 and discontinuing on December 31, 2021; and,

WHEREAS, that without the tax revenue from the 2015 income tax levy, the City cannot afford day-to-day operations; and,

WHEREAS, the Council of the City, after being advised of the necessity of this ordinance, finds that a similar ballot initiative must be presented to the electors of Fostoria on the November 3, 2020 ballot; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 718.01(C) of the Ohio Revised Code, the Council finds that the continuation of the one per-cent (1%) income tax levy as approved by the electorate on November 3, 2015 must continue for an additional five (5) years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Fostoria, Seneca, Hancock, and Wood Counties, Ohio:

SECTION 1. Sections one (1) through five (5) of Ordinance 2015-24 are hereby repealed and replaced with the following amendments:

SECTION 1. That a ballot initiative shall be placed on the 2020 general election ballot for the citizens of the City of Fostoria, Wood, Hancock and Seneca Counties, Ohio to continue, for an additional five (5) years, a one per-cent (1%) income tax levy, as described below.

SECTION 2. In addition to the permanent one per-cent (1%) municipal income tax established by ordinance B-664, there is hereby submitted to the voters of the City of Fostoria, Wood, Hancock and Seneca Counties, Ohio a proposal to continue a levy of a one per-cent (1%) income tax on salaries, wages, commissions and other compensation as hereinafter provided for the purpose of providing funds to be allocated for: Street Repair, Capital Improvement, Infrastructure, the Kaubisch Memorial Public Library, Parks and Recreation, Development, Beautification, and Citywide Cleanup, and the remainder to the general fund.

SECTION 3. The funds collected under the provisions of this ordinance establishing the renewal of the additional income tax shall be as follows:

1. Street Repair: \$200,000.00
2. Capital Improvement: \$200,000.00
3. Infrastructure: \$100,000.00
4. Kaubisch Memorial Public Library: \$30,000.00
5. Development: \$30,000.00
6. Parks and Recreation: \$30,000.00
7. Citywide Cleanup and Beautification: \$10,000.00.

The balance of funds available from this tax shall be placed in the general fund. This income tax levy shall be a renewal of the tax levy approved by the electorate on November 3, 2015.

SECTION 4. The revenue generated from the municipal income tax as specified in Sections 1, 2 and 3 herein shall be levied, collected, and paid with respect to the wages, salaries, commissions, sheltered annuities, bonuses, other compensation, net profits of businesses and professions or other activities earned or paid on or after January 1, 2022. This ordinance shall continue to be in effect until December 31, 2026.

SECTION 5. The Council of the City hereby approves ballot language attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A" as though fully re-written herein.

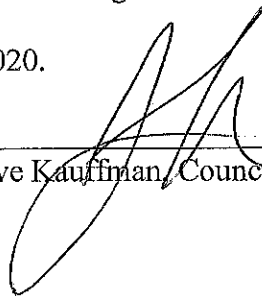
SECTION 6. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, and in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 7. The Director of Law shall furnish a certified copy of this ordinance to the Seneca county Board of Elections immediately upon its passage, and is authorized, directed and empowered to revise the ballot language contained in Exhibit "A" with the guidance of the Ohio Secretary of State's Office in the event the same needs amendment without further councilmatic action.

SECTION 8. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare. The reason for such emergency is the fact that this ordinance must be filed with the Seneca County Board of Elections at least ninety (90) days before the November 3, 2020 general election.

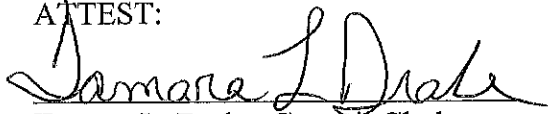

Shall the ordinance providing for the continuation of an existing one per-cent (1%) levy on income for the purpose of providing funds to be allocated for: Street Repair, Capital Improvement, Infrastructure, the Kaubisch Memorial Public Library, Parks and Recreation, Development, Beautification, and Citywide Cleanup, and the remainder to the general fund, commencing on January 1, 2022 and ending on December 31, 2026, at the same rate of one per-cent (1%), with the following allocation of funds be approved:

AN ORDINANCE

To authorize, direct and empower the Director of Public Service and Safety to terminate Lease to Geary Family Young Men's Christian Association of Fostoria, Ohio for real estate identified by Seneca County permanent parcel number P51-04-097896-00-00 (commonly known as Meadowlark Park/Foundation Park), and to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding for use of same real estate with the Geary Family Young Men's Christian Association of Fostoria, Ohio, and declaring an emergency to exist.

WHEREAS, a lease agreement authorized by Ordinance 2011-47 was entered into between the City of Fostoria and The Geary Family Young Men's Christian Association of Fostoria, Ohio on March 16, 2012 for real estate commonly known as Meadowlark Park/Foundation Park, and specifically identified by Seneca County, Ohio permanent Parcel number P51-04-097896-00-00; and,

WHEREAS, the parties to said lease agreement desire to terminate said agreement and enter into a new Memorandum of Understanding for use of same property; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Service and Safety has determined that it would be in the best interest of the City to enter into said Memorandum of Understanding, attached hereto and incorporated herein as though fully re-written herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Fostoria, Seneca, Hancock, and Wood Counties, Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the Council of the City of Fostoria, Ohio hereby authorizes, directs and empowers the Director of Public Service and Safety to terminate the Lease of real estate identified as Seneca County permanent parcel number P51-04-097896-00-00, and commonly known as Meadowlark Park/Foundation Park, Fostoria, Seneca County, Ohio with the Geary Family Young Men's Christian Association of Fostoria, Ohio.

SECTION 2. The Director of Public Service and Safety shall be authorized, directed and empowered to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding for use of real estate identified as Seneca County permanent parcel number P51-04-097896-00-00, and commonly known as Meadowlark Park/Foundation Park, Fostoria, Seneca County, Ohio with the Geary Family Young Men's Christian Association of Fostoria, Ohio.

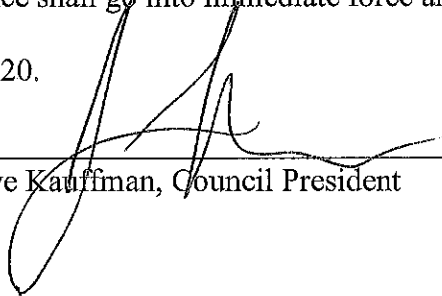

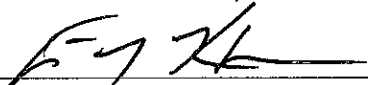

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN

THE CITY OF FOSTORIA, OHIO

AND THE GEARY FAMILY YMCA

WHEREAS the City of Fostoria owns Parcel# PSI-04-097896-00-00 part of which was formerly known as Meadowlark Park, now known as Foundation Park, and whereas the City wishes to have the Geary Family YMCA manage and operate the Park, and

WHEREAS the Geary Family YMCA is NOT in the business of managing parks, but is willing to help the City only until such time as a formal Park Board can be established,

WHEREAS the Parties wish to enter into a temporary, informal partnership for the operation of the Park and hereby execute this Memorandum of Understanding and terminate the previous lease agreement for said property which was entered into on March 16, 2012.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties to this Memorandum agree as follows:

1. The City shall maintain all utilities in the City's name and will pay for all utilities except the ball field lights on fields 2 and 3. The City will bill the YMCA for ball field light usage on a monthly basis to be budgeted. The City shall maintain and pay for all necessary insurance for the property. The YMCA shall also maintain and pay for liability insurance strictly for YMCA programming/functions. The YMCA shall ensure that all third parties utilizing the premises maintain their own liability insurance.
2. The City shall be responsible for snow removal on the premises and any other such items of maintenance commonly provided for City Parks except for any responsibilities to be performed by the YMCA as stated below.
3. The YMCA will maintain trash removal and emptying of barrels of trash throughout the park.

4. The YMCA shall oversee the lawn mowing of the commonly used and necessary areas, including the baseball parks scheduled for use and the area around the Amphitheater; shall oversee the operations of the concession stand; and shall utilize the grounds for organizational events as fits its programming schedule.
5. The YMCA will seek and gain approval in writing from the City before altering the current structure of the premises in any manner.
6. The YMCA may rent the ground being farmed and retain said rent for the operations of the Park.
7. The YMCA shall provide the City with notification of all outside groups renting or using the Park facilities. All outside groups shall carry their own liability insurance. The City shall have the right to veto any group rental provided said veto is returned within three business days.
8. The City and the YMCA shall provide to each other a list of machinery and equipment at the park as to ownership and use by each party.
9. The City shall provide the YMCA with the dates for its Independence Day celebration as well as for any concerts scheduled at the band stand. The Parties agree that multiple events may be scheduled by the Parties on the same day so long as such events are coordinated and communicated. The City maintains sole authority for use of the Wainwright Amphitheater. The YMCA shall be permitted to utilize the Amphitheater with prior approval in writing from the City.
10. The City shall provide set-up and clean-up for its events and the YMCA shall provide set-up and clean-up for its events.
11. This Memorandum does not apply to the City's recycling area.
12. The Parties agree that they will operate the parks under the laws of the City and the State of Ohio.
13. The YMCA agrees to save, defend, and hold the City harmless against all claims, demands, causes of action, suits of judgment,

including expenses incurred in connection therewith, for death or injuries to person or for loss or damage to property arising out of or in connection with the YMCA's use and occupancy of the Park.

14. The City agrees to save, defend, and hold the YMCA harmless against all claims, demands, causes of action, suits of judgment, including expenses incurred in connection therewith, for death or injuries to person or for loss or damage to property arising out of or in connection with any use and occupancy of the Park not related to YMCA programming/functions.

15. The City shall not be liable for any loss or damage to property of the YMCA occasioned by any defect in the Park, or by defective utilities, or by water, snow or ice on the premises

16. This Memorandum may be cancelled by either party upon 90 days advance written notice.

This Memorandum becomes effective upon the date of execution.

AN ORDINANCE

Adopting and Amending ordinance No. 2019-56 (Permanent 2020 Appropriations) by increasing appropriations and appropriating from unappropriated funds in the General Fund and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Fostoria, Seneca, Hancock, and Wood Counties, Ohio:

SECTION 1: That ordinance No. 2019-56 (Permanent 2020 Appropriations) passed December 17, 2019, be, and the same is hereby amended as delineated in the following sections:

SECTION 2: That Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 101-120-559001 General Fund – Security of Persons and Property-Fire/Capital Outlay-Furniture and Equipment.

SECTION 3: That this ordinance shall be published in accordance with applicable Ohio Law.

SECTION 4: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, and in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

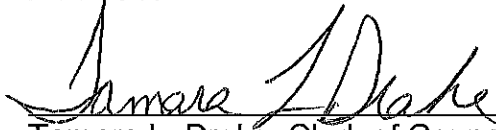
SECTION 5: That in order to preserve the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Fostoria and its inhabitants, and in order to make the appropriation adjustments in the Permanent 2020 appropriations without delay to meet pending obligations, this measure is determined to be an emergency ordinance and shall take effect at the earliest time allowed by law after its passage.

THEREFORE, upon the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all members elected to Council, and signature by Mayor, this ordinance shall take immediate force and effect.

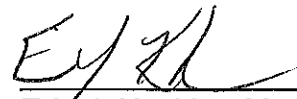
