## Holiday Party for our December meeting!!! Pot Luck Dinner!!

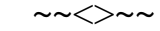
**Wednesday Dec. 11th** - 9 am decorating at the Lions Club.

**Ornaments ranging from \$10-12.**

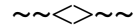

**Program for November:**

**Melba/Pebbled Rim (by L.E. Smith)**  
 presented by Lou Read



Melba or Pebbled Rim as it was called in the early years was made in 1930-36 and was the 4th pattern created by L.E. Smith in dinnerware. Originally in Pink and Green, later in 1936 added amethyst. It was given away at movie theaters.

Lou's mother Hazel Marie married in 1937 and started collecting in the 1940s. It could also be found at 5 and Dime store. In the 1950s finding a piece was exceptionally fun for Lou and his Mom. Later in the 1960s Lou brought more for his mom. In the 1970s, Lou's Dad died and his Mom remarried and when she moved she gave her glass to Lou who was living in Kansas City at the time. He then became serious about glass collecting and began his collection of cups and saucers.

In the 1980s and 1990s Lou found nothing in Melba. But in 2011 he found two bowls he had been looking for. Then 4 weeks ago he found a handled tray he had been looking for plus salad plates.

He also found a L.E. Smith candle holder in blue.

Lou thanked Keely Stockman for setting everything up for the presentation and creating the print out.
