How Has God Worked in Your Life?

Some people have a deep understanding of what God has done in their life. Maybe they have felt God has given them all they could possibly want, and more. Or, maybe they have experienced God answering their prayers very directly. Still others can point to miracles, medical or otherwise, to show how God has worked in their life.

Most people, however, can't point to specific situations when God stepped in and worked in their own life. But that doesn't mean God has not been doing so behind the scenes. Sometimes we need to take a step back and look at the big picture of our lives in order to see God's hand in it. Rest assured, God is in control, and He has guided your entire life so far, from the little everyday tasks to the life-changing events. Take a moment to reflect on your life, the different paths it has led you down, and try to see how God was with you the whole way.

God Works through Others

Sometimes we don't give enough credit to God, who uses other people in our lives to accomplish His will. He often uses family and friends to guide us, strengthen us, and encourage us. If you have had a family member or friend offer to help you out financially when you really needed it, taken care of you when you needed it, or given you food or clothing when you needed it, God was using that person to reach you.

Furthermore, God uses others as voices of reason for us, even when we are too wasted on drugs or alcohol to make the right choices ourselves. If anyone has encouraged you to get clean, to seek treatment, or to turn your life around, you can be sure God had a part in that conversation and He is working through others in your life. Listen to those people and get professional help if you need it.

God Works through the Church

We can't begin to understand the mind of God, but we can learn a lot about Him through His word. God uses His word, and those who share it with others, to work in your life. The church is there to provide access to God's word and help you understand it, but also to give godly guidance and advice. Listen to the solid advice you get from fellow Christians and spiritual leaders. They are the voice of God speaking to you. In order to see God continuing to work in your life, go to church, study the Bible, and pray, and actively look for what God is saying to you, how He wants you to turn your life around, and how He promises to guide you the whole way.

Saturday October 15, we made yalanchi and crescent cookies for the Food Festival October 20. Keep in mind, on Friday some of us make valanchi fill and rinse and lav out derev untiple grape leaves. Saturday, everybody gathers to roll sarma and crescent rolls. Everybody means Yettemites at heart, old friends and new, not only Ladies' Society members,. We finish about noon and then enjoy lunch, generously donated by Margie L. Davidian, Linda Farsakian-Wall, and sisters Marlene and Colleen Majarian. Atmosphere is filled with laughs and warm fellowship.

Next month, we make kufta, an endeavor similar to yalanchi, except with two days of prep first. Thursday, make the fill, heat on the stove and stir. For hours. Stir stir stir. One arm gets tired, switch to the other, take a break, someone else takes over. Stir stir stir. → Refrigerator. Friday, make balls of the filling. → Freezer. PARISH COUNCIL CORNER

On Sunday, November 13th following church services, we will gather in the Majarian Hall for a special fellowship in which we will commemorate the consecration of our current church sanctuary. During the time we have together we will watch some actual video footage of the building of the church and the church consecration service that took place on Sunday, November 16, 1947. Those in attendance will also be given a chance to share any keepsakes or memories of the event with others present.

The story of the building of our current sanctuary is written in our first St. Mary Anniversary book published in 1977 and in an album titled Yettem – A Cursory Overview prepared by Reverend Garabed Kalfayan in 1947.

In May 1945, St. Mary Parish Priest Fr. Garabed Kalfayan was selected to represent the clergy of the Western Diocese as a delegate for the election of the Catholicos in Holy Etchmiadzin. On his way home from that assignment he received a telegram from Neshan Tashjian (Chairman of the Board for St. Mary Armenian Church) containing the message "The Armenian Church of Yettem was destroyed by fire on June 12, 1945. Secure the necessary plans from Etchmiadzin and Jerusalem." In response, Father Garabed immediately wired back: "Do not worry about the church's being burned. We will yet build an even better one."

Several meetings were held beginning in July of 1945 to discuss where to rebuild the church -Dinuba, Visalia or Yettem. By a vote of 59 to 6, the membership finally decided to rebuild in Yettem. The Parish Board at that time consisted of Khacher Majarian, Harry Barsamian, Tateos Tamouzian, Humayak Sheklian, and Hacher Mikaelian. The board selected seven younger men to serve them to become the Building Committee. The seven included: Jack Peloian, Armen Menendian, Harry Majarian, Sarkis Tamouzian, Stephen Kaplan, Sarkis Simonian and Karnig Genian. Father Garabed made the recommendation to the greatest extent possible; the builders and workers be Armenian. Hence, Levon Koundourajian (Lawrence Cone) was selected as the architect for the project.

On September 29, 1946, on the Feast of the Holy Cross of Varak, sixteen stones were washed in water and wine and blessed with Holy Muroun (oil) and then placed as part of the foundation. (The

names of the Godfathers or sponsors will be included on a poster on

November 13th). The sixteen stones are for Christ's 12 Apostles, two evangelists who were not Apostles, St. Paul, and St. Gregory the Illuminator.

The building of the new church was begun almost immediately. Builders worked under the supervision of Garabed Simonian, assisted by Sarkis Simonian and Simon Kashian. Others who worked on the building were Mardiros Ekizian, Sirag Kalfayan, Marderos Mekaelian, and Garabed Shuklian. Many other parishioners worked voluntarily on this project as well.

To learn much more about this marvelous endeavor please join us for services and the fellowship on Sunday, November 13, 2022.



God is with You during Challenges

No one likes to face challenges, but God uses even the tough times to work in our lives. The poem, Footprints in the Sand, is a picturesque example of this. In the story, a man is walking along the beach with the Lord, as scenes from his life flash by him, both good and bad times. At the end of his life, as the man looked back, he saw footprints in the sand along the path he walked. He saw that most of the time, there were two sets of footprints: one belonged to him and the other belonged to God. But he also noticed that at the darkest times of his life, the most challenging times, there was only one set of footprints. The man was troubled and asked God why, when he was going through the biggest struggles, God left him. God answered, "My son, I love you and I would never leave you. During your times of suffering, when you could see only one set of footprints, it was then that I carried you."

We don't often see it, but God does indeed work in our lives through trouble and hardship. Sometimes He uses these times to help us grow or to benefit those around us. He might use challenges to stop us from doing something harmful or to motivate us to do what is right. Sometimes He just allows trouble to enter our lives to bring us closer to Him. Remember this the next time you are facing a difficult day, God is with you and will see you through.

God works through You

Finally, God works in your life through the things you say and do. Part of being a Christian is sharing God's love with others. If you have known God's love and guidance through your life, you need to share that with others. If you have a loved one who is experiencing some difficulty or has made some bad decisions, talk to them and offer your godly advice. If you see someone in need and you can help, do something about it. Be that source of encouragement and love that the world so desperately needs. Know that as you work to put God first and live a sober life of renewal, God is using you to work in others' lives as well.
