AVOID PENALTIES BY UNDERSTANDING POSTMARKS

Utility payments must be received or **postmarked** by the 25th of each month to avoid penalties. If a payment is received after the due date, with no postmark, the payment is considered late and a 10% penalty will be imposed in accordance with City Code. **POSTMARKS** are imprints on letters, flats, and parcels that show the name of the United States Postal Service (USPS) office that accepted custody of the mail, along with the state, the zip code, and the date of mailing. The postmark is generally applied, either by machine or by hand, with cancellation bars to indicate that the postage cannot be reused. Utility Customer sending payments by mail are cautioned that the USPS only postmarks certain mail depending on the type of postage used, and may not postmark mail on the same day the payment is mailed. Payments mailed at the Moran post office will generally reach City Hall within two days. CORNER FIREWORKS

CODE

7-303 SAME; EXCEPTIONS; DISCHARGES. (a) Section 7-302 of this article shall not apply to the fire or discharge of fireworks within the City between the hours of 8:00 AM. and 11:00 PM. on June 27th through July 5th.

(b) The governing body of the City may, in its discretion, grant permission at any time for the public display of fireworks by responsible individuals or organizations when such display or displays shall be of such a character and so located, discharged and fired as shall not be a fire hazard or endanger persons or surrounding property.

(c) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to give any public display of fireworks without having first obtained a permit thereof.

7-304. SAME; EXCEPTION; SALE OF FIREWORKS. Any person, firm, or corporation who or which has first obtained a valid permit to sell fireworks within the City may do so between the hours of 8:00 AM. and 11:00 P.M. commencing June 27th and through July 5th of each year.

7-305. APPROVED FIREWORKS; BOTTLE ROCKETS PROHIBITED. (a) All fireworks offered for sale and discharged within the city shall be of a type that has been tested and approved for sale and use within the state by the state fire marshal. (b) Bottle rockets and other similar self propelled firework or fireworks devices consisting of a tube and attached guiding stock or rod shall not be sold or discharged in the city.



The Moran Police Departments encourages you to always remember your outdoor pets.

Summertime humidity and high temperatures are just around the corner. These weather conditions require extra care for your outdoor pets.

♦ Never leave an animal in your vehicle, as temperatures inside a vehicle can reach well over 120 degrees in a matter of minutes.

♦Be alert to the signs of heat exhaustion. Look for excessive panting or general lethargy, which may be signs your dog is overheated.

Always be certain outdoor pets have access to plenty of shade and fresh water.

Water Conservation Tips

<u>Inside</u>

- * Do run the dishwasher and washing machine only when full. Save even more by using the short cycle.
- Don't let the water run while washing dishes. Kitchen faucets use 2 to 3 gallons a minute. Filling a basin only takes 10 gallons to wash and rinse your dishes.

<u>Outside</u>

- * Don't allow sprinklers to water your street or sidewalk.
- * Water your lawn or plants before 9am or after 7pm.
- * Place 3-4" layer of mulch around trees and plants to retain moisture to keep the soil cool. Replace your mulch once a year.

Bathroom

- * Do take short shower and save 5 to 7 gallons a minute.
- * Don't run the water while shaving, washing your hands or brushing your teeth. Faucets used 2 to 3 gallons a minute.

Everywhere

- * Do repair leaky faucets and turn taps off tightly. A slow drip wastes 15 to 20 gallons each day.
- * Don't forget to shut off your hoses and be sure to check your seals and gaskets as new ones help save water.
