This summer as a church we are going to be looking at what it means to be a warrior of faith! Heading into summer we often see fitness programs or

even local 5k's centered around pushing ourselves to the physical limit. Being a physical warrior with strength, endurance, and speed. But this summer I'd like to start out by looking at what it takes to be a spiritual warrior. This month I'd like to explore the virtues that define a true warrior - patience, strength, courage, and honor.

Patience: A Warrior's Steadfast Endurance

I think the physical equivalent to patience might be endurance. The ability to continue to press toward the goal without quitting or getting distracted. As warriors of faith, we are called to practice patience, trusting that God's plans unfold in perfect harmony with His divine will

Strength: A Warrior's Resilient Spirit

Ironically for spiritual warriors our strength is often found in the moments we feel weakest. In our weakness, God's power is made perfect. Like Samson, who found strength in his surrender to God's purpose, we too can draw strength from our dependence on the Almighty. As we face trials, let us tap into God's limitless power, knowing that His strength is made perfect in our weakness.

Courage: A Warrior's Fearless Resolve

True warriors are marked by their courage in the face of adversity. They are not exempt from fear, but they rise above it, knowing that God goes before them. Gideon, though initially fearful, displayed courage as he followed God's instructions to lead the Israelites against the Midianites. In the same

way we can move forward boldly in faith, trusting that God will equip us with the courage to conquer any battle we face.

Honor: A Warrior's Noble Character

Honor is the foundation of a warrior's character. It encompasses integrity, humility, and a commitment to righteousness. In a world that often prioritizes personal gain and self-interest, we are called to remain faithful and virtuous in the face of temptation. As warriors of Christ, let our lives radiate integrity, reflecting the love and grace of our Heavenly Father.

As we study these virtues of spiritual warriors, let us pray for God's Spirit to empower us to be steadfast in our daily battles. May we be shining examples of God's power by the spiritual power He gives to us!

#### **Trinity UCC Congregational Meeting**

The Trinity United Church of Christ, Elliston Special Congregational Meeting was held on Sunday, May 7, 2023 following the church service. The meeting was called to order by President, Rebecca Reif with a prayer.

Rebecca presented that the Trustees, Council and 2030 Team approved a proposal to replace 12 windows in the hall area. All committees/teams felt that the quote received from Radiant Windows was competitive. The approval of \$15,000 was requested. A question was asked if the windows will match the current ones in other rooms. The answer was that the interior is not wood, but could be done for an additional \$300 per window. The quote reflects a white interior. The exterior will match. Existing Memorial Funds will be used for this project.

Janene Gahler motioned to approve the proposal + spending \$15,000 to replace the windows. Sarah Zibbel  $2^{nd}$ . MC.

Rebecca introduced the Capital Improvement Firm Foundation campaign. This campaign will begin in the future to raise funds for maintenance and care of the church + hall for years to come.



Justin (our coworker) was praying for his landlord, who was in the hospital after a stroke, and he felt the Holy Spirit prompt him to do something; he would buy flowers for his landlord's daughter, Alija. Here in Slovenia, there are few landlord-tenant relationships that are very good, and so this would be hugely counter-cultural, but in obedience he called her, and met her to offer his prayers for her and her family, and to give her the flowers. She was understandably shocked by Justin's kindness, and she asked him why he would do this?



Justin explained to her that he and his family were followers of Jesus, and he felt Jesus encourage him to do this for her, and her response... "Which Jesus?" Justin laughed and as they talked she was very open and interested in what our team does. She seemed interested in the idea of personal Bible Study and application, as its something she had never really experienced growing up as a cultural catholic without personal relationship with God. Immediately after Justin left, she called her parents and excitedly shared her experience.

This whole story reminds me the importance of why we are here. We are here living lives in obedience to Jesus, which often puts us at odds with the culture around us. But this difference often reveals to people the longings in their own lives, and causes them to ask, who is this Jesus, and how can I know Him as well?

In one week we will be flying to the US for the summer. We look forward to meeting with you to share more stories of God's faithfulness, and update you on how your investment is brining Jesus into the lives of people across Slovenia. We will be in Ohio for most of June, and in Texas for most of July. We are excited for this season of connecting with you, it always brings such joy to us and our family. For those of you from Ohio, we will be contacting you soon to begin to set up meetings. We are really excited to meet with

you, and for you to meet Milo! You are and have been a significant part of our ministry and family, and we look forward

to seeing you soon!
