FEMA Releases El Nino Response Plan

A federal emergency response plan has been prepared by a joint state and federal task force with a series of worst-case scenarios of the havoc that El Nino could cause this winter and guidelines to help federal, state, and local leaders deal with such disasters. In addition, agencies are convening in Sacramento to conduct a tabletop exercise testing various response measures.

Using data from previous El Nino years and new estimates by states and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the task force developed four alert levels: 1) normal operations; 2) elevated threat; 3) credible threat; and 4) disaster response. FEMA's Disaster Response Plan also has three phases addressing power outages, evacuations, temporary shelters, food and water requirements, and medical shelters for Region IX which covers the southwest. Per the suggestion of NOAA scientists, the Plan's model used information from the 182-83 El Nino season, which recorded 36 storm-related deaths, 481 injured, and an estimated \$1.2 billion in economic losses including 6,661 homes and 1,330 businesses damaged or destroyed.

According to the report, "There is substantial risk in Northern California (NorCal) due to potential levee failures. The Sacramento -San Joaquin Delta is particularly vulnerable to levee failures due to its location, aging infrastructure, low elevation, and subsidence." A consistent message promoted by the federal, state, and agency representatives was to encourage homeowners to consider buying supplemental flood insurance now because new policies require a 30-day period before taking effect.
