Angie Rees

Angie and Larry Rees joined Parkside Bible Church in 2005 when Rob Renberg was the pastor. They had moved to Holland from Grand Ledge earlier that year to be closer to their family. Angie met Larry, a tall, handsome navy veteran, in the early 1950s and they were married in 1955 in Flint. Within a couple years Larry joined the Michigan

State Police and was posted in Brighton for 5 years. Their next move was Bay City - another 5 year assignment - and finally to Lansing where he reminded until retirement. Grand ledge became their home for 39 years where they raised three children, Steve, Kris and Brian.

Angelie (Angie) Noble was born and grew up on Manitoulin Island in northern Lake Huron. Fishing and lumbering were the basis for the economy on this Canadian island and her father had a fishing business. When the depression hit in the 1930s, fishing would not support the family, so her father had to find other work and eventually joined the Canadian military.

The Noble family were strict Catholics and Angie attended a Catholic school with her sister and brother. There was an Indian village on the island and those children attended the same school so Angie had many friends from that village. About 1950 her sister, Muriel (Mert) a

registered nurse, immigrated to Flint in the United States. Angie joined her a couple years later where she met Larry. Both Angie and Mert became U.S

citizens so Angie now has both Canadian and U.S. citizenship.

When Angie and Larry moved to Holland they bought a house on Pine Lake Ct. just a mile from Parkside Church where she has many friends. Over the years they have made many improvements and upgrades to the home. However, with Larry's death last year, the house is now for sale. Angie also has several friends living at Appledorn and she is looking forward to joining them. Angie has an apartment there and will soon enjoy independent living there.

Special Event



The Super Seniors are invited to a special meeting on Wednesday, October 24 at 10:30 am in the Fellowship Area. We will host a special speaker who will discuss the November 6th midterm elections. Midterm

refers to the election held half way between presidential elections. Many believe this election is one of the most important in recent years. There will be 35 (including one from Michigan) of the 100 Senate seats and all 435 House seats on the midterm ballot.

Traditionally, voter turnout for midterm elections is much lower than for presidential elections. Turnout for the last three presidential elections was just over 60 % of eligibles voters which was much higher than any recent midterm election. To encourage Parkside members to learn more about this important midterm election and what's involved, the Super Seniors are invited to this special event.

Jay Riemersma, a member of Parkside Bible Church, will be the speaker. Jay will be discussing the importance of Christian citizenship. Why is it important for Christians to vote and make their voice hard? What are the current threats to religious liberty? What are some recent victories? Most importantly, he will be encouraging our members to stay engaged in the process from a Christian worldview.

Jay first joined Family Research Council (FRC) in November 2007, but stepped down from that role in 2009. Jay mounted a bid for the United State Congress in Michigan's 2nd District. Although his message promoting the traditional values on which our nation was founded



resonated with voters, he was narrowly defeated.

Congress' loss has certainly proved our communities gain. In 2010, Family Research Council was pleased to announce the return of Jay Riemersma to their team. Currently, he serves as the Senior Directory of Development, strategically leading the field staff in advancing the message of Faith, Family and Freedom throughout the country. As an ambassador for FRC and because of his unique background and gifts, Jay is well equipped to communicate FRC's vision with key supporters.

If his "difficult to pronounce" last name (Riemersma) sounds familiar, you may recognize him from his successful football career a University of Michigan Alum and his nine year professional career with the Buffalo Bills and Pittsburgh Steelers. Although Jay was born in Evansville, Indiana, he moved to Zeeland with his family when he was just 4 months old. Jay has attended Parkside Bible Church his entire life.

Following Jay's presentation and a time for questions, a soup and sandwich lunch is being planned at church. There will be additional information as the date approaches and a sign-up sheet at the Welcome Desk for this event.
